## Planning Proposal to amend Great Lakes Local Environmental Plan 2013

I am writing in response to your Council's letter dated 7 August 2014 requesting a Gateway determination under section 56 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 ("EP&A Act") in respect of the planning proposal to amend the Flood Planning Maps in the Great Lakes Local Environmental Plan 2014.

As delegate of the Minister for Planning, I have now determined that the planning proposal should proceed subject to the conditions in the attached Gateway determination.

In relation to S117 Direction 4.3 Flood Prone Land, Council is to consult with the Office of Environment and Heritage prior to community consultation in relation to consistency of the planning proposal and supporting flood studies with the *Floodplain Development Manual 2005*. Any comments from the Office of Environment and Heritage are to be placed on exhibition with the planning proposal. Council may still need to obtain the Department's approval to comply with the requirements of S117 Direction 4.3 Flood Prone Land. Council should ensure this occurs prior to the plan being made.

The Minister delegated plan making powers to councils in October 2012. It is noted that Council has requested to be issued with delegation for this planning proposal. I have considered the nature of Council's planning proposal and have decided to issue an authorisation for Council to exercise delegation to make this plan.

The amending Local Environmental Plan (LEP) is to be finalised within 9 months of the week following the date of the Gateway determination. Council should aim to commence the exhibition of the planning proposal as soon as possible. Council's request to draft and finalise the LEP should be made directly to Parliamentary Counsel's Office 6 weeks prior to the projected publication date. A copy of the request should be forwarded to the Department for administrative purposes.

The State Government is committed to reducing the time taken to complete LEPs by tailoring the steps in the process to the complexity of the proposal, and by providing clear and publicly available justification for each plan at an early stage. In order to meet these commitments, the Minister may take action under section 54(2)(d) of the EP&A Act if the time frames outlined in this determination are not met.

Attached for your assistance is a simplified guide to the plan making process and reporting requirements to ensure that the LEP Tracking System is kept updated.

## **Gateway Determination**

Planning Proposal (Department Ref: PP\_2014\_GLAKE\_002\_00): to amend the Flood Planning Maps in the Great Lakes Local Environmental Plan 2014.

I, the General Manager, Hunter and Central Coast Region at the Department of Planning and Environment as delegate of the Minister for Planning, have determined under section 56(2) of the EP&A Act that an amendment to the Great Lakes Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 2013 to amend the Flood Planning Maps should proceed subject to the following conditions:

- Community consultation is required under sections 56(2)(c) and 57 of the Environmental 1. Planning and Assessment Act 1979 ("EP&A Act") as follows:
  - the planning proposal is classified as low impact as described in A Guide to Preparing LEPs (Planning & Infrastructure 2013) and must be made publicly available for a minimum of 14 days; and
  - the relevant planning authority must comply with the notice requirements for public (b) exhibition of planning proposals and the specifications for material that must be made publicly available along with planning proposals as identified in section 5.5.2 of A Guide to Preparing LEPs (Planning & Infrastructure 2013).
- Consultation is required with the Office of Environment and Heritage under section 2. 56(2)(d) of the EP&A Act. The Office of Environment and Heritage is to be provided with a copy of the planning proposal and any relevant supporting material, including flood studies, and given at least 21 days to comment on the proposal.
- A public hearing is not required to be held into the matter by any person or body under 3. section 56(2)(e) of the EP&A Act. This does not discharge Council from any obligation it may otherwise have to conduct a public hearing (for example, in response to a submission or if reclassifying land).
- The timeframe for completing the LEP is to be 9 months from the week following the date 4. of the Gateway determination.
