10.2.2 Shellharbour Planning Proposal No. 4/2016 - Proposed Heritage Item - Shellharbour City Council Local Government Area Northern Boundary (10747003)

Summary

The purpose of this report is to seek Council's resolution to prepare a Planning Proposal to amend *Shellharbour Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 2013* to bring the Northern Boundary of the Shellharbour City Council Local Government Area (LGA) into Schedule 5 (Environmental Heritage) as an Item of Local Heritage Significance.

In addition, it is recommended that Council undertake further comparative research to determine conclusively all aspects of the rarity of the boundary at a State level. If at the completion of the research it is considered of state significance Council lodge a nomination for the Shellharbour City Council Local Government Area Northern Boundary to be added to the State Heritage Register.

The location of this boundary is shown in **Attachment 1** and a list of affected properties can be found in **Attachment 2**. It is worth noting that the land affected by the Calderwood Major Project Approval is unable to be included in the proposed listing as it falls under the Major Projects Environmental Planning Policy and not the Local Environmental Plan.

The report also recommends that the Planning Proposal be submitted to the NSW Planning & Environment (DPE) seeking a Gateway determination to enable the public exhibition of the Proposal. A copy of this report will form part of Council's submission to the NSW Department of Planning & Environment.

Background

On 16 February 2016 Council received a request from a resident for Council to make an Interim Heritage Order over the existing boundaries of the Local Government Area (LGA).

This request was made due to the imminent threat to these boundaries as a result of the State Government's current merger proposal to amalgamate Shellharbour City Council with Wollongong City Council. The Shellharbour Local Government Boundaries were proclaimed on 4 June 1859. This proclamation appeared in the supplement to the NSW Government Gazette of 8 June 1859 and the boundaries have remained largely unchanged since that date.

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On 23 February 2016 Council resolved to:

- '1. Make an Interim Heritage Order in accordance with Section 25 of the Heritage Act 1977, over the properties listed in Attachment 1 of this report in order to immediately protect the historic integrity of the local government area which is under imminent threat as a result of the current merger proposal by the State Government for Shellharbour City Council and Wollongong City Council.
- 2. Arrange for the gazettal of the Interim Heritage Order in the NSW Government Gazette.
- 3. Advise the affected property owners of Council's resolution.
- 4. Advise the Heritage Office of the Department of Planning and Environment NSW of Council's resolution.
- 5. Advise the Acting Chief Executive of the NSW Office of Local Government and his delegate of Council's resolution.
- 6. Advise the Minister for Local Government of Council's resolution.'

On 26 February 2016, Shellharbour Interim Heritage Order 1/2016 was published in the NSW Government Gazette No 15 which can be found as **Attachment 3**.

The NSW Heritage Branch Guidelines state that:

'The intent of an Interim Heritage Order is to provide temporary protection for a potential heritage item under threat. After the order has been placed, Council has 6 months to finalise the assessment of the item, including to resolve to prepare a local environmental plan that will list the item in a heritage schedule and finalise preparation of that plan. Interim Heritage Orders can only be used to provide short-term protection for potential heritage items. Local Councils should protect heritage items in the longer term through the planning system'.

Council could only consider placing an Interim Heritage Order on private properties affected by the existing boundary which is under threat. Areas where the existing boundary is located on Crown Land, Council owned land or land affected by the Major Projects State Environmental Planning Policy are not identified to be included in the IHO; this is because under specified conditions attached to authorisation for Council to make an IHO Council is unable to affect these lands.

However, heritage listings may be placed over all relevant land with the exception of land affected by the Major Projects State Environmental Planning Policy as they are excluded from the Local Environmental Plan. It is therefore intended to place the listing over all other land located on the boundary.

Council subsequently engaged a suitably qualified Heritage Consultant to undertake a more detailed assessment of the heritage significance of the proposed heritage

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item (Northern Boundary of the Shellharbour LGA). This report has been used to assist and inform Council on the suitability of placing the proposed heritage item on schedule 5 of the LEP to ensure its protection through the planning system. The full report can be found in **Attachment 4**.

In summary, the detailed heritage assessment has made the following conclusions and recommendations:

'The heritage significance assessment contained in this report has shown that the northern boundary of Shellharbour City Council as defined in the Interim Heritage Order has significance at a local level and potentially at a State level.

The northern boundary of the City of Shellharbour has local heritage value and should be included in Shellharbour Local Environmental Plan 2013 as a heritage item in Schedule Five. The boundary meets all seven heritage significance criteria at a local level.

The northern boundary of the City of Shellharbour also has the potential to have State heritage significance under the criteria of history and rarity. Further comparative research is required to determine conclusively all aspects of the rarity of the boundary at a State level. A nomination to the State Heritage Register is recommended.'

Financial / Resources Implications

If Council resolves to prepare a Planning Proposal, there is no Financial or Resource Implications except for staff time to prepare and process the proposal.

There are no fees applicable to this Planning Proposal as it has been initiated by Council.

Legal and Policy implications

Should Council support the preparation of a Planning Proposal, the Planning Proposal will need to be sent to the NSW Department of Planning & Environment for Gateway assessment and approval to place the Planning Proposal on public exhibition.

The Planning Proposal will need to be prepared, exhibited and assessed in accordance with the requirements of the *Environmental Planning & Assessment Act* and *Regulations*, the *Guide to Preparing Planning Proposals* and the *Guide to Preparing Local Environmental Plans* prepared by the NSW Department of Planning & Environment.

<u>Council Decision Making During Merger Proposal Periods – Section 23A of the Local</u> <u>Government Act 1993</u>

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The Office of Local Government's (OLG) document *Council Decision Making During Merger Proposal Periods* includes general principles and a number of specific guidelines. The general principles and regulatory guidelines of relevance are:

Councils and council officials should not make decisions during a merger proposal period that:

- Seek to damage or impede the operational effectiveness of a new council including by (but not limited to)
- Make significant and/or ongoing financial commitments that will be binding on a new council
- Make other significant undertakings or commitments that will be binding on a new council
- Make decisions that are designed to limit the flexibility or discretion of a new council
- Would not otherwise withstand legal challenge on the basis that the new council and not the outgoing one would need to defend any such challenge.

These guidelines have been considered and the progression of the Planning Proposal does not conflict with the guidelines.

Delegations

It is not recommended that Council use any of its Planning Proposal delegations for this proposal.

Public / Social Impact

Placing the Northern Boundary of the LGA on Schedule 5 Environmental Heritage of Shellharbour LEP 2013 will ensure its recognition as an item of Environmental Heritage with Local Heritage Significance. It will ensure that any potential impact on this heritage significance is considered as part of any proposed development on the affected properties. Most importantly it is an acknowledgement of the significance of this item to the local community and ensures that the story behind the significance is documented in legislation.

Placing the Planning Proposal on public exhibition will provide an opportunity for interested parties to provide their views for Council's consideration.

Recommendation

- 1. That Council confirm its consideration of the guidelines issued by the NSW government in accordance with Section 23A of the Local Government Act, 1993, in resolving on this matter.
- 2. That Council prepare Planning Proposal No 4/2016 to amend Shellharbour Local Environmental Plan 2013 in the following manner:
 - a. Amend Shellharbour LEP 2013 Schedule 5 Environmental Heritage by inserting the Shellharbour City Council Local Government Area Northern Boundary and required information as outlined in Attachment 5
 - b. Amend Shellharbour LEP 2013 Heritage Map in accordance with Attachment 1
- 3. That Council authorise the General Manager to submit Shellharbour Local Environmental Plan 2013 Planning Proposal No 4/2016 to the NSW Department of Planning & Environment in accordance with section 56 of the *Environmental Planning & Assessment Act 1979* for review and gateway determination.

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- 4. That Council delegate to the General Manager authority to make minor mapping and Local Environmental Plan instrument changes to Shellharbour Local Environmental Plan 2013 Planning Proposal No 4/2016 if and as required by the NSW Department of Planning & Environment's LEP Review Panel and gateway determination.
- 5. That Council and Council staff not use the plan-making delegations from the Minister for Planning on this Planning Proposal.
- 6. That Shellharbour Local Environmental Plan 2013 Planning Proposal No 4/2016 be publicly exhibited in accordance with the gateway determination.
- 7. After the public exhibition period has closed, that a report be submitted to Council for consideration detailing the public exhibition outcomes and with further recommendations regarding adoption.
- 8. That Council undertake further comparative research to determine conclusively all aspects of the rarity of the boundary at a State level. If considered to meet the criteria of a Stage Heritage Item, Council lodge a nomination for the Shellharbour City Council Local Government Area Northern Boundary to be added to the State Heritage Register. This would be subject to a further report to Council.
