

Gateway Determination

Planning proposal (Department Ref: PP_2020_GOULB_001_00): to amend the zoning and lot size of land adjacent to Dossie Street Goulburn under the Goulburn Mulwaree LEP 2009.

I, the Director, Southern Region at the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment, as delegate of the Minister for Planning and Public Spaces, have determined under section 3.34(2) of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* (the Act) that an amendment to the Goulburn Mulwaree Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 2009 as described above should proceed subject to the following conditions:

1. The proposed minimum lot size map (Figure 6 in the planning proposal) is to be revised to show the proposed 2,000m² minimum lot size area.
2. Council shall undertake the following studies and investigations prior to public consultation:
 - A Stage 2 Detailed Site Investigation for Council-owned land subject to the planning proposal.
 - An Aboriginal Heritage Due Diligence Assessment for Council-owned land subject to the planning proposal.
 - An Acid Sulphate Soil Assessment for the subject site.
3. Public exhibition is required under section 3.34(2)(c) and schedule 1 clause 4 of the Act as follows:
 - (a) the planning proposal must be made publicly available for a minimum of **28 days**; and
 - (b) the planning proposal authority must comply with the notice requirements for public exhibition of planning proposals and the specifications for material that must be made publicly available along with planning proposals as identified in section 6.5.2 of *A guide to preparing local environmental plans* (Department of Planning and Environment, 2018).
4. Consultation is required with the following public authorities/organisations under section 3.34(2)(d) of the Act and/or to comply with the requirements of relevant section 9.1 Directions:
 - NSW Rural Fire Service
 - NSW Roads and Maritime Service
 - WaterNSW
 - NSW Environment Protection Authority

- Department of Planning, Industry and Environment (Biodiversity and Conservation Team)

Each public authority/organisation is to be provided with a copy of the planning proposal and any relevant supporting material and given at least 21 days to comment on the proposal.

5. Council shall consult with the Pejar Local Aboriginal Land Council on the planning proposal and give at least 28 days to comment on the proposal.
6. A public hearing is not required to be held into the matter by any person or body under section 3.34(2)(e) of the Act. This does not discharge Council from any obligation it may otherwise have to conduct a public hearing (for example, in response to a submission or if reclassifying land).
7. The planning proposal authority is authorised as the local plan-making authority to exercise the functions under section 3.36(2) of the Act subject to the following:
 - (a) the planning proposal authority has satisfied all the conditions of the Gateway determination;
 - (b) the planning proposal is consistent with section 9.1 Directions or the Secretary has agreed that any inconsistencies are justified; and
 - (c) there are no outstanding written objections from public authorities.
8. The time frame for completing the LEP is to be **18 months** following the date of the Gateway determination.
