I am writing to advise the Sydney Eastern City Planning Panel (the Panel), that the planning proposal (PP-2021-3539) to facilitate a combined hotel and serviced apartments development at 146-154 O'Riordan Street, Mascot is ready to commence exhibition.

As you may recall, on 9 March 2022 the Panel determined that the proposal should proceed to Gateway assessment and later appointed itself as the planning proposal authority (PPA).

The Department issued a Gateway determination for the proposal on 12 May 2022, with minimal conditions that did not require any updates to the planning proposal. In accordance with the conditions of the Gateway determination the proposal is required to commence exhibition on 12 July 2022.

Should the Panel approve, the Department will carry out the exhibition on behalf of the panel and in accordance with the Gateway conditions. The intended exhibition package can be found at the following one drive link: Exhibition Package -146-154 O'Riordan Street, Mascot
