## Planning proposal PP\_2021\_4130 to amend Clarence Valley Local Environmental Plan 2011

I am writing in response to Council's request for a Gateway determination under section 3.34(1) of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* (the Act) in respect of the planning proposal to facilitate a highway service centre as an additional permitted use on Lot 2 DP 634170, Schwonberg Street, Townsend.

As delegate of the Minister for Planning and Public Spaces, I have now determined that the planning proposal should proceed subject to the conditions in the enclosed Gateway determination.

I have also agreed, as delegate of the Secretary, the planning proposal's inconsistencies with section 9.1 Directions 1.5 Rural Lands, 2.2 Coastal Management, 2.3 Heritage Conservation, 4.1 Acid Sulfate Soils, 4.3 Flood Prone Land and 5.10 Implementation of Regional Plans are justified in accordance with the terms of the Direction. No further approval is required in relation to these Directions.

Council will still need to obtain the agreement of the Secretary to comply with the requirements of relevant section 9.1 Direction 5.4 Commercial and Retail Development along the Pacific Highway, North Coast. Council should ensure this occurs prior to the plan being made.

I have considered the nature of Council's planning proposal and have conditioned the Gateway for Council to be authorised as the local plan-making authority.

The amending local environmental plan (LEP) is to be finalised within 9 months of the date of the Gateway determination. Council should aim to commence the exhibition of the planning proposal as soon as possible. Council's request to draft and finalise the LEP should be made directly to Parliamentary Counsel's Office six weeks prior to the projected publication date. A copy of the request should be forwarded to the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment.

The state government is committed to reducing the time taken to complete LEPs by tailoring the steps in the process to the complexity of the proposal, and by providing clear and publicly available justification for each plan at an early stage. In order to meet these commitments, the Minister may take action under section 3.32(2)(d) of the Act if the time frames outlined in this determination are not met.
