Re: Liverpool Hospital Helicopter Landing Site (HLS) Western Flight Path Analysis

Dear Mr. Wilson,

In response to your email date Friday, 2 October 2020 to Ms Kerrie Elliot, existing and proposed developments in Liverpool CBD are encroaching into and having a material impact on the approach and departure flight paths for the Hospital Helicopter landing site. As a consequence of the flight path review recently conducted for the western approach/departure path for the Liverpool Hospital main helicopter landing site (HLS), I can inform you that the outcome is a revised flight path direction that is further north than the previous flight path. Our analysis resulted in the attached map with the new flight path depicted in purple. This flight path has been accepted by NSW Ambulance and also their helicopter contractor – Toll Helicopters.

We understand that there are a number of developments in the pipeline and would like to request your assistance on the issue of crane positioning and illumination. Given the proximity of the developments to the flight path, cranes will directly impact the access to the HLS from the west. To this end, we ask that any crane strategy includes:

- That cranes are positioned to have minimal impact (crane arc and height) on the western flight path
- That cranes are illuminated along the length of the jib with white light (fluro) or NVG compatible LED strip lights (Heliflex). This needs to be in addition to any lights required under the CASA Manual of Standards (MOS) Part 139, which is inadequate for obstructions close to a hospital HLS or flight path.
