## PP-2021-5615



The Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure issued a Gateway Determination on 24 November 2023. An assessment against the Gateway Determination has been undertaken (see **Table 1**).

The Planning Proposal Authority team is satisfied that the planning proposal and supporting documents have been updated to meet the conditions of the Gateway Determination and the planning proposal can proceed to finalisation.
