The guns provided anti-aircraft protection for the Rathmines Catalina Sea Plane Base, where many RAAF officers were trained during the course of World War Two. The site remains important to the ex-military personel who trained and served at the base, along with the wider Wangi community, who regard it as part of their history and heritage. **Historical Notes** The Gun emplacements and ammunition store were a secret millitary installation built at or Provenance: Wangi during 1942/3. The anti-aircraft command centre was part of the defence system for the State listed Rathmines Sea Plane Base built during a period when Australia feared a Japanese invasion. The site is particularly important as an antiaircraft battery for the Catalina aircraft that operated out of the Rathmines Sea Plan Base and were operated by personnel from the Base.
