Themes:	Historical Notes - 2010: Morisset became a town in the late 1880s. The town owes its existence to the advent of the railway line, which opened in August 1887. Subdivisions and the first Crown Land sale followed in 1888. Logging in the Wattagan Mountains and timber production were the town's main industry. It can be assumed that the Hall was built to commemorate the end of the First World War and the men who served their country in that war. Since then, the Hall has been used extensively by the community as a social gathering point up until the present day. Examples of the various uses are; as a meeting place for residents, as a place for dances, plays to be performed by the local drama group (who convened their first meeting in the Hall), and as a meeting place for the Country Women's Association. The Hall was also the venue for films when 'talkies' were introduced. Patients from Morisset Hospital had a permanent booking for the films. People came from as far as Dora Creek to see the films. In 1953 the Hall was extensively damaged by fire, but was rebuilt the same year by local volunteers.
