Historical Notes or Provenance:	Part of the key communications infrastructure for the World War Two Sea Plane Base at Rathmines erected just after the outbreak fo war. The bunkers served as VHF/DF transmitting stations. They are semi-underground and were proofed against bomb blast and splinters. At the time, they were disguised by thick bush, but the ground has now been cleared, being situated under power lines. The bunkers were equiped with their own water and power supply and operated 24 hours a day by men and women. A large 'wind up' tower was also part of the site. During the 1950s and 60s the radio equipement in the Bunkers was taken by the amateur West Lakes Radio Club.
