## Re: DRAFT AMENDMENT TO DUNGOG LEP 2014 PLANNING PROPOSAL – RECLASSIFICATION OF THE CLARENCE TOWN MUSEUM SITE.

At the Ordinary Meeting of Council held on the 20 September 2016, Council resolved to endorse the Planning Proposal to amend the Dungog Local Environmental Plan 2014, pursuant to Section 55 of the *Environmental Planning & Assessment Act 1979* (EPA Act), in order to reclassify Lot 20 DP 729796, Prince Street Clarence Town from Community to Operational land.

In accordance with Section 56 of the EPA Act Council is now forwarding the Planning Proposal to the Minister for a gateway determination.
