I am writing to consult and seek feedback on the above Planning Proposal, as a condition of Gateway determination and to ensure to consistency with the requirements of applicable directions of the Minister under section 9 of the Act.

The Proposal seeks to carry out the following amendments to the Cessnock Local Environmental Plan 2011:

- make changes to rural zone objectives;
- make changes to development types that are permitted in rural zones;
- make administrative changes to how and where rural zones are applied in the Cessnock LGA, to address inconsistent zoning and minimum lot sizes, and;
- make changes to minimum lot size clause relating to land requiring on-site waste water management (septic) systems.

The Planning Proposal follows the recommendations of the Rural Lands Issues Paper completed by Cessnock City Council's Strategic Planning Team. This Paper was the result of a detailed review of the provisions contained in the LEP 2011 as they apply to rural lands, and the alignment of these with the strategic framework, to ensure consistency with the relevant priorities and principles for land contained in the Cessnock Local Strategic Planning Statement (LSPS) 2036 and other relevant local and regional plans and strategies.
