# Introduction

The Landscape Masterplan Concept proposals illustrate design principles and strategies, and following review with Council will form the basis for subsequent Concept Development for formalised proposals. The subject site is in the south-east corner of the town centre, as shown with the magenta outline below. The site has an important role for the precinct, with dedication of land proposed to allow an active green streetscape edge to Howatt Street out to Woodville Road. In addition, the further Council initiative (additional to the Structure Plan) is to expand Hilwa Park through resuming houses to the west of this site. The concept sketch proposals provided demonstrate this area as providing an extension of the north axis down through this area with a feature termination in an active civic space and community garden.

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### Town Centre Landscape Context

The site is located to the southern edge of the urban renewal area of Villawood Town Centre. Hilwa Park is understood to be proposed by Council to be expanded to include the area to the west of the subject site, assuming that houses can be added into the park area. More generally, the park is proposed to be upgraded (see previous page Structure Plan, so that the open space provides an appropriate high quality / high amenity southern green edge to the significantly upgraded town centre.

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### Subject Site Context - Landscape Design Principles

The Landscape Masterplan Concept proposals illustrate design principles and strategies, and following review with Council will form the basis for subsequent Concept Development for formalised proposals. The subject site is in the south-east corner of the town centre, as shown with the magenta outline below. The landscape masterplan has been developed with the architect and project team to create a landscape setting that integrates the project with the adjoining streetscape and open space, and provides a substantial contribution to the upgrading of the town centre. Hilwa Park is understood to be proposed by Council to be expanded to include the area to the west of the subject site, assuming that houses can be incorporated into the park area. More generally, the park is proposed to be upgraded (see previous page Structure Plan, so that the open space provides an appropriate high quality / high ameniuty southern green edge to the significantly upgraded town centre.

Principles of concept landscape design for project and adjoining areas is to demonstrate:

- This site provides a defining green edge to the expanded park, and a framing built form that extends the new 'Villawood Place' civic axis:

- The upgraded overall contemporary park will create an activated place for people on the civic axis, with broad passive and play areas to the west:

- Existing toilets are inappropriate termination of civic link, and are integrated into a new con-temporary kiosk / café with foreground public art as the terminating focus of the axis;

- The community gardens south of the kiosk provide a strong focus for residential engagement, with fruiting trees along the eastern edge, and seating pergola to the west;

- The café plaza, café kiosk, and community garden, along with the retail forecourt extending along the streetfront together create a vibrant, activated southern edge to the town centre.











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## Civic plaza with water feature



The continuation of Villawood Place visual axis is reinforced with a focal public artwork, an upgraded cafe pavilion / amenities building, to replace existing low quality toilet block in this focal location. The civic space and water feature adjacent creates a active gateway into the park.

Cafe pavilion, and extend the active retail frontage to the east, with outdoor seating combining with cafe opposite to frame entry to the park

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# Community Gardens with Pergola



Community gardens south of the pavilion have an adjacent pergola and covered tables and chairs. A quality green backdrop to the gardens is provided with mass planting to the rear of the proposed supermarket on the ground floor. Trailing planting from the level 1 residential gardens above combine with the planting below to create a strong green edge.

Community garden for interactive and social activites for locals in the area

Pergola and picnic seating for community in the area

Level 1 common open space provides trailing green edge

Discrete driveway location set away from the green edge to the park.





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# Hilwa Park Upgrading



Key to the Council Structure Plan is for the open space to encourage an active community and provide a high quality parkland edge that responds to the town centre precinct. The existing playground is proposed to be relocated and upgraded to locate it as the visual focus of views down the western north-south roadway, and also in views from Kamira Avenue to the west to fully engage with local residents. This location at the 'elbow' of the park maximises benefit, and allows linking parkland to each side.
