Assessment Against Gateway Determination

The Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure issued a Gateway Determination on 23 February 2023. Since this time the planning proposal and supporting documents have been updated in accordance with the Gateway conditions. An assessment against the Gateway Determination has been undertaken (see **Table 1**).

The Agile Planning team is satisfied that the planning proposal and supporting documents have been amended to meet the conditions of the Gateway Determination and the planning proposal can be placed on to public exhibition.
