Dear Mr McKee

I refer to your letter to the former Minister for Environment and Heritage regarding an interim heritage order (IHO) request for 17A Edward Street, Gordon.

I write to advise you, pursuant to section 24 of the *Heritage Act* 1977, I have resolved to make an IHO for the above item because it may, on further inquiry or investigation, be found to be of local heritage significance.

It is intended that an IHO period of 12 months will allow Ku-ring-gai Council adequate time to assess its heritage significance and determine whether listing as a local heritage item on the Ku-ring-gai Local Environmental Plan 2015 is warranted.

The IHO will be gazetted in the next available NSW Government Gazette.

The effect of the IHO is that approval from the Heritage Council under the *Heritage Act* 1977 is required for any works for the duration of the order.

Section 57(1) of the Heritage Act 1977 states:

"When an interim heritage order or listing on the State Heritage Register applies to a place, building, work, relic, moveable object, precinct, or land, a person must not do any of the following things except in pursuance of an approval granted by the approval body under Subdivision 1 of Division 3:

- a) demolish the building or work,
- b) damage or despoil the place, precinct or land, or any part of the place, precinct or land,
- c) move, damage or destroy the relic or moveable object,
- d) excavate any land for the purpose of exposing or moving the relic,
- e) carry out any development in relation to the land on which the building, work or relic is situated, the land that comprises the place, or land within the precinct,
- f) alter the building, work, relic or moveable object,
- g) display any notice or advertisement on the place, building, work, relic, moveable object or land, or in the precinct,
- h) damage or destroy any tree or other vegetation."

02 7225 6042 nsw.gov.au/ministers I note that the making of an IHO does not impede the ability of an owner to bring forward a proposal for the property, however, it does make the Heritage Council an approval body for the proposed works and that those works would be assessed in terms of the impact on the heritage significance of the property.
