6. Business Item Recommendations

2010SYE088 - North Sydney - 404/10 - mixed use development containing 202 apartments, 7 serviced apartments, ground floor retail and 150 car parking spaces - 200-220 Pacific Highway, Crows Nest

- 1) The Panel resolves unanimously to accept the recommendation of the planning assessment report to approve the application, subject to
 - a) the conditions recommended in the report;
 - b) the conditions recommended by the RTA in its letter dated 2 March 2011;
 - c) provisions being made for three, rather than two car share spaces;
 - d) the floor on the roof of Building 3 being acoustically treated;
 - e) 1.6m high obscure glass screens being provided to the western edges of balconies on ground level in Building 3;
 - f) screens or louvres being provided to the northern edge of north-facing balconies to prevent overlooking of the terraces of 236 Pacific Highway; and
 - g) opaque balustrades being provided to the west-facing balconies at levels 1-4 of Buildings 2 and 3.
- 2) The Panel has considered the submissions of all objectors, the elected council and Councillor Baker. Those objections relate to traffic, overlooking, overshadowing and view obstruction.
- 3) As concerns the traffic impact, the Panel notes that both the council's traffic engineer and the RTA have found that impact acceptable.
- 4) As concerns overlooking, the Panel is satisfied that, with the conditions additionally imposed by this Resolution, the overlooking impact will be minor. In the case of the backyards of the Sinclair Street properties, the existing impact will be improved.
- 5) As concerns overshadowing, the Panel is satisfied that, while there will be some additional overshadowing, the council's requirement for dense urban areas of a minimum of two hours of sunlight at mid-winter will be met for all nearby properties.
- 6) As concerns view obstruction, the Panel is satisfied that the extent of obstruction to the properties at 236 Pacific Highway, when taken in the context of the whole view now enjoyed, will be minor.
- 7) The Panel has considered the planning report's assessment of the SEPP 1 Objections submitted by the applicant in relation to height, building height plane and non-residential FSR as well as the Objections themselves. The Panel is satisfied that the Objections are wellfounded and that strict compliance is unreasonable and unnecessary.
