Elizabeth Ashby has extensive experience in flora and fauna survey and impact assessment. She worked as a scientific researcher for the NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service and the Royal Botanic Gardens from 1983 to 2001, investigating such things as the impact of logging on forest fauna and vegetation classification and mapping of large areas of NSW, including forests and grasslands of the coast and tablelands, mallee and shrublands of the far west, fragmented woodland of the central wheatbelt and grasslands of the Riverina.

Elizabeth initiated the research program at NSW NPWS for Grey-headed Flying-foxes in the late 1980's. This work eventually led to the species being listed as a threatened species. She is a recognised expert in vegetation classification and mapping and has produced many vegetation maps and other papers that have been published in refereed scientific journals.

Elizabeth has worked as an ecological consultant since 2001 - running her own company since 2004 – and in that time has advised on several hundred projects of varying sizes and complexity. She was one of the first people to be accredited by the then Department of Environment and Climate Change as a BioBanking Assessor and is often called upon by both the Commonwealth and State conservation agencies to be part of small technical working groups. She was elected President of her professional body the Ecological Consultants Association of NSW in 2005 and remains as part of the Executive Council of the ECA.
