This **Addendum to the Statement of Heritage Impact** has been prepared in response to the request by Hornsby Council for detailed proposals with regard to the heritage interpretation of the Petticoat Lane buildings adjacent to Lober House.

#### PETTICOAT LANE BUILDINGS

#### PROPOSED WORKS

The following works are proposed on the Petticoat Lane buildings.

1. Archival Recording

Prior to their demolition the Petticoat Lane buildings will be archivally recorded by means of:

- Annotated measured drawings; and
- Archival photography in accordance with *Heritage Information Series: Photographic Recording* of *Heritage Items Using Film or Digital Capture*, NSW Heritage Office 2006.
- 2. <u>Demolition</u>
- 3. Interpretation

On completion of construction of the new Health Building and roadway, interpretation of the Petticoat Lane buildings will be undertaken as shown on Jackson Teece Drawing No. DA1900\_A, following.

In summary the interpretation measures comprise:

- Markers of bricks in the new footpath and roadway showing the outline and position of the demolished buildings; bricks salvaged from the demolished buildings will be used for the outline markers; and
- The interpretative story of the known history of Petticoat Lane accompanied by imagery applied to the glazed wall of the new Health Centre building behind.

#### ASSESSMENT OF IMPACT ON HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE PETTICOAT LANE BUILDINGS

The detrimental impact on the heritage significance of the Petticoat Lane buildings arising from their demolition is acceptably offset by the proposed archival recording and interpretation measures.

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
