This letter contains the Office of Environment and Heritage's (OEH) general terms of approval (GTA), in accordance with Integrated Development Approval (IDA) (development application 387/2012/DA-S, Lot 4 DP247902, Pt Lot 63 DP1104486, Lot 64 DP1104486, UWS Campbelltown Campus, 183 Narellan Road, University Basin Reserve, Narellan Road, Campbelltown), for those known Aboriginal sites that would require an Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit (AHIP) pursuant to s.90 of the *National Parks and Wildlife Act* 1974 (the Act).

OEH notes that the Aboriginal archaeological and cultural assessment that accompanies the IDA is still in draft format, no comments from the Aboriginal community had been received by the time of the submission of the IDA application and that associated fieldwork has not taken place to date, therefore, no management recommendations have been proposed for the Aboriginal cultural and scientific values of the development area. On the basis of this, OEH can only provide generic GTAs at this stage.

OEH has the following requirements in relation the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage associated with the above development:

- Adequate management and mitigation measures should be developed for Aboriginal Cultural Heritage within the proposed development area. These measures should be developed in consultation with the Aboriginal community and should be informed by the completed archaeological assessment:
- Impacts to Aboriginal objects as a result of the proposed development should be avoided where possible;
- Where this is not possible, a s90 AHIP application must be submitted to OEH prior to the commencement of the development;
