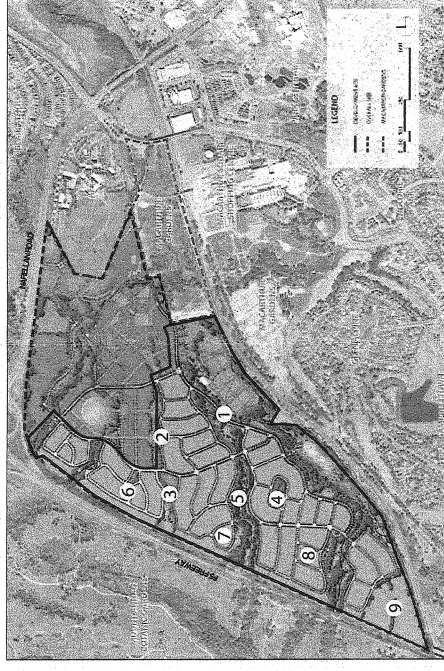
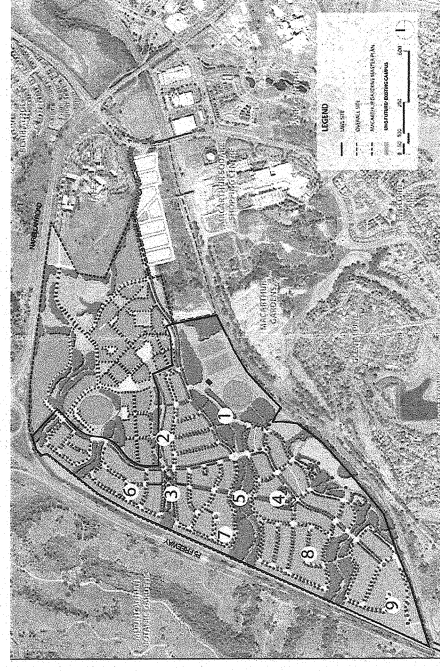


6.0 KEY REVISIONS

	ADOPTED 2007 MASTER PLAN	REVISED 2011 MASTER PLAN
1	Collector road	Downgraded to a low-key emergency access, reducing construction costs and improving open space connectivity
2	Park edge road	Removed to create a naturalistic, pedestrian orientated linear park providing an improved transition between student accommodation and new housing
3	Hill-Top Park 1	Reconfigured to create a more defined interface between the public domain and adjoining houses
4	Hill-Top Park 2	Located on the collector road, offering a site for a potential bus stop and views to the lake and highly integrated into the village
5	Riparian Park	Creates a strong physical and visual connection between the ridge-top parks with a bridge crossing on a strong axis of realigned thoroughfares
6	Small open space	Replaced with stronger connections to Ridge-Top Park and Riparian Parkland
7	Street down contours	Replaced by a pedestrian path, significantly reducing cut and fill requirements
8	Street	Rationalised to avoid streets running down steeper contours, reducing cut and fill costs and concealing changes to natural landform (away from the public streetscape)
9	Large lots	Replaced with traditional lots better suited to broader housing needs, with access by a series of streets, closes and pedestrian passages
