 Reasons for the panel decision: The panel adopted the recommendation of the assessment report to refuse the development application for the reasons detailed in the report and as amended at the meeting. The reasons for the panel decision are: That Development Application No.271/14 for an extractive industry at Lot 24, DP 705683, 4003 Pacific Highway, Dirty Creek, be refused for the following reasons; The application proposes development on Lot 76, DP 752828 and the owner of this land has not consented to the application being made (as required by Regulation 49 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation). The application is not in accordance with Director General's Requirements that have been issued by the Department of Planning with respect to the proposed crushing works. Plans of the proposed development are not in accordance with Part 1 of Schedule 1 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment regulation 2000. Adequate information with respect to blasting, flora and fauna impacts, rehabilitation and sediment and erosion control for the development has not been provided to enable likely impacts of the proposed development to be assessed. The safety, efficiency and ongoing operation of the Pacific Highway may be adversely affected by the development. The application has been in for a lengthy period of time without the required information being provided and this is not in the public interest.
