



Development Proposal for Public Exhibition

Council has received a development application from Nova Power Pty Ltd for the proposed fit-out and use of an industrial building for electricity network support at Lot 238 DP 260481, No. 15 Huntsmore Road, Minto.

This development proposal will be determined by the Joint Regional Planning Panel (Sydney West Region) as it is 'electricity generating work' valued at more than \$5 million dollars. Further information on this process can be obtained from the website <http://www.jrpp.nsw.gov.au/>.

The application has been made as an Integrated Development, pursuant to Section 91 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act, 1979. In addition to requiring Development Consent, the proposed works are also required to obtain an Environment Protection Licence from the Office of Environment and Heritage under the Protection of the Environment Operations Act, 1997.

The application and accompanying Statement of Environmental Effects are on exhibition and are available for review at the ground floor of Council's Civic Centre during Council's ordinary office hours and at the HJ Daley Library, Hurley Street, Campbelltown and the Greg Percival Library cnr Oxford and Cumberland Roads, Ingleburn.
