The panel determined by the vote of the majority of 3 to 2 to approve the development application as			
described in Schedule 1 pursuant to section 80 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979			
subject to three additional conditions as below. John Roseth, David Furlong and Stuart McDonald voted			
with the majority; Anthony Boskovitz and Toni Zeltzer voted with the minority. The minority decision was to			
approve the application with the additional condition to delete the berths at the eastern end of Arm A.			
Panel consideration:			
The panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at			
meetings and the matters observed at site inspections listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.			
Reasons for the decision of the majority of the panel:			
1. The Panel accepts the planning assessment report's conclusion that the adverse impacts of the			
proposal are acceptable and that there are some environmental benefits arising out of it.			
2. A major reason for the Panel's decision is the removal of the swing moorings that forms part of this
