Decision:

Reasons for the panel decision:

The proposal meets the needs and desires of the Newington College without causing unreasonable impacts on the surrounding development.

The Panel considered the objectors' concern about the overshadowing impact of the shade cloth and balustrade of the raised tennis court and recommended their removal by new conditions.

Conditions: As per revised version of the conditions of consent supplied by Council on 16 December 2014, with the following amendments made at the meeting:

- 1. In Deferred Commencement Condition 1 "Council's satisfaction" is changed to "Council".
- 2. In condition 20 "3 dBA" is changed to "5 dBA" and the Note following the Condition is deleted.
- 3. In Conditions 50 and 57 "any" is changed to "the relevant".
- 4. Two additional conditions are imposed to remove the shade cloth and balustrade on the eastern side of the tennis court.
