Determination and Statement of Reasons

2014SYW056 – Camden Council – DA 269/2014 – Construction of a public school with a capacity of 780 students, car parking, landscaping and associated site works, 26-36 Springs Road, Spring Farm.

Date of determination: 19 December 2014

Decision:

The panel determined to approve the development application as described in Schedule 1 pursuant to section 80 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

Panel consideration:

The panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and the matters observed at site inspections listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

Reasons for the panel decision:

- 1. The proposed school is an essential infrastructure item required to service the rapidly developing urban area of Spring Farm.
- 2. The proposed school is sited in accordance with the provisions of Camden LEP 2011 prepared to guide the development of the Spring Farm urban area.
- The proposal adequately satisfies the provisions of the relevant State Environmental Planning Policies including State Environmental Planning Policy (Mining, Petroleum Production and Extractive Industries) 2007, State Environmental Planning Policy (Infrastructure) 2007 and State Environmental Planning Policy No. 55 – Remediation of Land.
- 4. The proposal adequately satisfies the provision of Camden LEP 2010 and Camden DCP 2011.
- 5. The proposal as amended is considered to provide satisfactory, off street parking arrangement and adequate temporary arrangements for the set down and collection of students. In this regard the Panel notes that it will be necessary, as this area of Spring Farm develops further, for permanent set down and drop off facilities to be installed in road 6 of the Development Control Plan.

6. In consideration of conclusions 1-5 above the Panel considers the proposal is in the public interest. **Conditions:** The development application was approved subject to the revised conditions in the Council Addendum Report with minor change to Condition 2, the following words must be added -

• No drop off or pick up is to occur on the northern side of springs road.
