Decision:

The panel determined to approve the development application as described in Schedule A pursuant to section 80 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

- Demolition is required as the state of the existing building on the site is a source of health and safety issues and therefore not in the public interest
- We recommend that Health Infrastructure negotiate with Council regarding opportunities for the reuse of materials locally.
