DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST	Ms Kara Krason declared a non-pecuniary conflict of interest as she formerly worked with a relative of an adjoining objector, and did not participate in the matter.
	Ms Susan Budd was involved in the original decision for deferral but since became aware of a potentially perceived non-pecuniary Conflict of Interest, as an employee of the applicant firm (not related to the DA) was a friend of a partner, which may give rise to a perception of a Conflict of Interest.

Public meeting held at Lake Macquarie City Council on Thursday 9 February 2017 opened at 2.30pm and closed at 4.45 pm. Electronic determination consideration from 15-24 May 2017, with a decision made on 24 May 2017.

2015HCC020 – Lake Macquarie City Council DA/1043/2015, Residential Care Facility, Lot 2 DP 788892, 158 Macquarie Road, Cardiff.

#### PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The Panel considered: the matters listed at Item 6; the material listed at Item 7 and the matters observed at site inspections listed at Item 8 in Schedule 1.

The Panel determined to approve the development application as described in Schedule 1 pursuant to section 80 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The decision was unanimous.

### **REASONS FOR THE DECISION**

The Panel generally agreed with conclusions and balance of the environmental assessment within the Council staff report. The proposal will have social benefits, with some economic benefits, and the development was suited to the site, with environmental impacts able to be appropriately managed and/or mitigated by the conditions of consent. Further reasons included:

- 1. The Panel agreed with the Council staff that the proposal complied with the Council staff analysis and opinion that the proposal complies with Clause 40 of SEPP (Seniors Housing and People with a Disability) 2004. Despite this, if it was held a variation was legally necessary, the Panel noted there were sufficient environmental planning grounds to justify the variation as outlined in the applicant's submission (although also noting the applicant's reasons to support the variation request were technically sought through a Clause 4.6 Variation Request of the LEP rather than SEPP 1).
- 2. The supplementary report has adequately addressed the matters identified in the reasons for deferral arising from the Panel meeting of 9 February 2017.
- 3. The proposal will provided for Seniors Housing, which will benefit the wider area.
- 4. The proposal is permissible and consistent with the zone objectives.
- 5. The proposal complies with the building height and is below the allowable Floor Space Ratio.
- 6. The specific nature of the site, including its size, site proportions, surrounding infrastructure, nature of adjoining development and proposed design measures, resulted in a development that suited the site

and did not cause any significant impacts on neighbouring land, with impacts appropriately managed or mitigated through conditions of consent.
