Public meeting held at Lake Macquarie City Council, 126-138 Main Road, Speers Point on 31 August 2017, opened at 3pm and closed at 3.25pm.

MATTER DETERMINED

Waste Management / Recycling Facility involving composting of green waste and associated works, at 367 and 413 Wilton Road Awaba (AS DESCRIBED IN SCHEDULE 1)

PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The Panel considered: the matters listed at Item 6, the material listed at Item 7 and the material presented at meetings and the matters observed at site inspections listed at Item 8 in Schedule 1.

The Panel determined to approve the development application as described in Schedule 1, pursuant to section 80 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The decision was unanimous.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The Panel generally agreed with the environmental assessment and balance of considerations within the Council staff assessment report. In particular, the Panel agreed with the assessment and analysis concluding the proposal was "substantially the same development" as approved (and thereby able to be determined under Section 96 of the EPA Act 1979) and that the modifications did not trigger the "designated development" provisions of the EPA Act 1979 and associated Regulations. Council staff shared some internal legal advice with the Panel regarding the issue of designated development.

While a Clause 4.6 Variation Request was lodged due to the non-compliance with the LEP height limit for the site, the Panel noted that legally and technically such a Variation Request was not necessary. However, the Panel did consider the proposal in terms of both Section 96 and Section 79C of the EPA Act and found the proposal was acceptable, notwithstanding the proposed height, with the reasons and site-specific considerations outlined in the submitted documentation and assessment report having merit.

The proposal will have positive social and economic impacts and can be considered to represent sustainable development, as well as rational and orderly development of land. The proposal is suited to the site and the impacts are either acceptable or able to be appropriately managed and mitigated by the proposed Conditions, as amended.

CONDITIONS

The development application was approved subject to the conditions in the Council Assessment Report with the following amendments. These amendments arose from very recent advice from the Environmental Protection Authority regarding their terms of approval, and to clarify that a condition regarding Environmental Management applies during operation, not just construction.

The following amendments to the recommended conditions apply:

- Condition 8 shall be amended to conform with the revised Terms of Approval received from the Environment Protection Authority by email dated 31 August 2017.
- Condition 14 shall be amended so the Heading states "Construction and Operational Environmental Management Plan", and the first sentence and subsequent references throughout the Condition refer to this terminology.
