Public meeting held at Christie Conference Centre 3 Spring Street Sydney on 3 August 2017, opened at 2:00 pm and closed at 3:45 pm.

MATTER DETERMINED

2016SYE128 - Inner West - DA201600585 at West Street Petersham (AS DESCRIBED IN SCHEDULE 1)

PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The Panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and the matters observed at site inspections listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

The Panel determined to approve the development application as described in Schedule 1 pursuant to section 80 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The Panel adjourned during the meeting to deliberate on the matter and formulate a resolution.

The decision was unanimous.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The Panel agreed to support the Council's recommendation for approval as the proposal complies with the aims, objectives and design parameters contained within Marrickville Local Environmental Plan 2011 and Marrickville Development Control Plan 2011.

The Panel considered that condition 18 relating to the Section 94A contribution should be deleted for the following the reasons:

- 1. The proposal is for a community and social purpose and should be exempt from Section 94A Contributions in accordance with the discretionary exemption provisions in Section 2.17 of the Marrickville Section 94/94A Contributions Plan 2014.
- 2. The applicant, the NSW Department of Education, has declined to accept the condition.
- 3. The amount of the deleted condition does not have a substantial impact on Council finances so consultation with Council is not required.

The Panel notes that the proposed development does not increase the demand for services and facilities in the local area.

The Panel expressed its frustration with the lack of a clear policy exempting the NSW Department of Education from section 94 Contributions. The Panel Chair will write to the Minister of Planning urging him to clarify the Government's position on the payment of Section 94 contributions for public schools.

CONDITIONS

The development application was approved subject to the conditions in the Council Assessment Report with the exception of the deletion of condition 18 in regards to the Section 94 contributions.
