Dear Graham,

Background and Purpose of Document

In NSW, Aboriginal objects, whether recorded or as yet undiscovered, are afforded statutory protection under the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974*. Under Section 86 of the Act it is an offence to disturb, destroy or deface Aboriginal objects without the approval of the Director General of the Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH). A breach of Section 86 of the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974* could result in prosecution and fines in excess of \$1 million. The OEH provides a series of guidelines as a framework for identifying and managing Aboriginal heritage and the cultural heritage interests of Aboriginal parties within development planning contexts. The Due Diligence process is the first step and is outlined in the *Due Diligence Code of Practice for the Protection of Aboriginal Objects in NSW* (DECCW, 2010) guidelines and is intended to identify whether or not a proposed activity is likely to harm Aboriginal objects.

It is understood that as part of the assessment of the proposed development at 15 Rynan Avenue, Edmondson Park, NSW (Lot 22 DP631868) (hereafter 'the study area') (**Figure 1**) Liverpool City Council has requested a due diligence assessment pertaining to Aboriginal heritage. Joshua Farkash & Associates Pty Ltd has engaged Archaeological and Heritage Management Solutions Pty Ltd (AHMS) to inspect the site and provide further advice on Aboriginal heritage management in relation to the Due Diligence guidelines, and associated legislative requirements under the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974*.

Existing Environment

The location of the proposed works in Edmondson Park is situated within the Blacktown soil landscape (Bannerman & Hazelton, 1990). This is a residual landscape dominated by shallow duplex soils, comprised of thin clay loam topsoil (A1 horizon) over heavy clays (B horizon), and usually <50cm deep. The heavy clay unit is generally considered to pre-date the Aboriginal colonisation of Australia, and therefore only the upper A1 horizon has the potential to contain Aboriginal objects. The shallow nature of these deposits has significant implications for the potential and survivability of Aboriginal objects - even minor disturbance and/or de-vegetation (such as continuous ploughing observed in the 1970s - 2010s (**Figure 3 - 8**)) will often result in the complete removal of the upper parts of the soil profile in which objects may occur.

The nearest permanent source of fresh water is Cabramatta Creek, which flows through the centre of the study area. Cabramatta Creek would have been a permanent fresh water source for Aboriginal people in the past. Originally, this area would have been dominated by open and/or dry sclerophyll forest, but most of the area is now urbanised and cleared; creeklines and associated riparian corridors contain regrowth vegetation. Such clearing also impacts integrity of archaeological deposits, and will have removed trees modified (scarred or carved) by Aboriginal people in the past.

Archaeologically, this region (part of the Cumberland Plain) has been extensively investigated, with research dating back to the 1940s (e.g. McCarthy, 1948). Much of our current knowledge of the region, however, comes from extensive survey and excavations undertaken through compliance-based archaeology associated with development, which began in the 1980s (e.g. Haglund, 1980; Kohen, 1986, 1993; Smith, 1989) and continues to the present day (e.g. Jo McDonald Cultural Heritage Management Pty Ltd (JMCHM), 2005a, 2005b, 2005c; AMBS 2003, AMBS 2011, Austral Archaeology 2008, Navin Officer 2007, GML (2012), AHMS (2010, 2014)). While local variation in the archaeological record is apparent, for the most part the distribution and type of archaeological material across the Cumberland Plain region is well understood. In a recent compilation of several decades of previous research by White and McDonald (2011), it was concluded that the archaeological record in this area was almost entirely composed of varying concentrations of Aboriginal objects (isolated finds, background scatters and artefact scatters) all situated within 200m of water sources; and with more extensive/significant deposits all occurring within 100m of major creeklines. Aboriginal objects are often dominated by silcrete raw materials, which are found as outcrops locally.

Of specific relevance to this study area:

- AMBS (2003) undertook surveys of the region as part of the Edmondson Park Composite Site (EPCS) Master Plan in 2003 which included the residential development to the west of the study area. It was noted that 13 artefact scatters and five isolated finds had previously been recorded across the EPCS, comprising a total of 276 artefacts, and that, "[m]ost sites were located in areas of low or moderate disturbance along tributaries of Maxwells Creek, either on the alluvial flats immediately adjacent to the creekline or on the associated elevated, gently sloping undulating rises above the creeks" (AMBS 2003:10). The survey identified 15 new stone artefact sites (EPCS 1 - EPCS 15), comprising a total of 32 artefacts.
- AMBS (2011) also undertook a survey on the neighbouring development to the west of the study area at Lot 9 DP1127207, Lot 182 DP1147508 and Lot 231 & Part Lot 232 DP1147509, Camden Valley Way, Edmondson Park. A previously recorded Aboriginal artefact scatter, AHMS site #45-5-3533 (SWRL Site 8), was identified containing 25 stone artefacts. There was no surface expression of AHMS site #45-5-3246 observed in the study area during the survey.

- Austral Archaeology (2008) undertook test excavations at Horningsea Park Archaeological Deposit 1 (#45-5-3285), approximately 160 metres to the north of the study area. Thirty stone artefacts were recovered from shallow deposits (c.30cm deep) on the west bank of Cabramatta Creek. Silcrete was the most common raw material (representing 69.7%) followed by silicified tuff (22.2%) and quartz (9.1%). It was concluded that the west bank of Cabramatta Creek was used intermittently by Aboriginal people as a temporary camp site, and that the low density of artefacts represented 'background scatter' resulting from casual use, tool repair and material discard.
- Navin Officer (2007) undertook test excavations on the rise overlooking Cabramatta Creek, in the vicinity of AHIMS site #45-5-3246, approximately 400m southeast of the study area. A low density of subsurface artefacts was recovered, 33 in total from 68 pits (an average of 1.3 artefacts per square metre that was excavated), with the majority on the low slope near the southern bank of a second-order tributary of Cabramatta Creek.

A search of the OEH Aboriginal Heritage Information Management System (AHIMS) database recovered 118 sites in the general area (**Appendix 1; Figure 1 and Figure 2**). Of these 118 sites, 89% were recorded as artefact scatters, 5% as potential archaeological deposits, 4% as stone arrangements and 1% as art. There was one site recorded as a scarred tree #45-5-0777, but this has been subsequently deregistered after the tree was found to be only approximately 50 years old, and likely of non-cultural origins.

There are no registered AHIMS sites listed in the study area.

The sites that are near to the study area and in close proximity to Cabramatta Creek (**Figure 2**) include:

- **#45-5-3285** Archaeological Deposit (subsurface Aboriginal archaeological objects) is located 230m to the north of the study area on the west bank of Cabramatta Creek. This site was excavated by Austral Archaeology in 2008 and thirty stone artefacts were recovered from shallow deposits (c.30cm deep).
- **#45-5-3307** Potential Archaeological Deposit (PAD). HSP PAD 1 on the western side of Cabramatta Creek 320m north of the study area. It is likely to extend at least 100m west of the creek edge where the land has not been disturbed.
- **#45-5-3373** Isolated Aboriginal object located 190m southwest of the study area. It was identified as a red silcrete flake found during subsurface testing program.
- **#45-5-3246** Artefact Scatter located 400m south of the study area. EPCS 5 comprised of three silcrete flakes. It was assessed to have moderate to high archaeological potential, because while this scatter was small, it was located on the foot slopes of a substantial rise overlooking Cabramatta Creek. Undisturbed deposits were considered likely on this slope below the plough zone because of its prime geographic location: The associated ridge is one of three vantage points across the site.

Site Inspection

A site inspection was undertaken by Michelle Lau (AHMS Heritage Consultant) on 21 July 2014. The property was investigated for the presence of Aboriginal objects, or the potential for them to occur. The residential property and private land was not accessed during this inspection. The inspection was focused on areas of soil exposure and identifying ground disturbance.

From a general perspective the study area is within 200m of water, a landform of interest which is considered to have high potential for Aboriginal objects to occur (see discussion above). The land comprises flat level land, located within 200m of Cabramatta Creek.

The inspected part of the study area revealed modifications to the original landscape. The eastern portion of the study area, from the east bank of the creek to Rynan Avenue has been recently modified, and the risk for impacting Aboriginal objects is considered to be low. Heavy continuous ploughing and levelling associated with residences was identified across the east of the study area (mapped in **Figure 9**), the western area has been subject to less continuous disturbance (from the western boundary to the west bank of Cabramatta Creek).

The area on the western bank of Cabramatta Creek had evidence of ploughing and the natural soil profile is considered to be low-moderately disturbed in this area. The vegetation around the creek and tributary in this area has been allowed to grow back (**Plate 1**). It was noted that this western area had more of a natural surface profile compared to the paddock to the north of the study area (in Lot 1 DP774700) (**Plate 2**). It is assumed most likely that this area was in continuous agricultural use over the past 50 years, but it not clear to what extent the study areas natural slope has been altered or remains intact. In this area there were several subterranean services (electricity and gas) and overhead services (electricity) observed and a sewerage line is also known to run north south through this area (**Plate 3**).

Ground surface visibility across the study area was generally low, vegetation cover obscured any exposures in the western area. However, the undulating ground profile suggests over-lying A horizon deposits (which usually contain Aboriginal objects if present) may still remain. No Aboriginal objects or potential deposits were identified in the study area.

Areas on the east bank of the study area show more recent modifications including a residential house and outbuildings (sheds and workshops). In the east area, the ground has been modified to create level surfaces for construction of the residence, sheds, workshops and agricultural areas (**Figure 9**). It is considered unlikely that intact A horizon topsoils remain in this area where the ground would have been graded at the time of construction of structures or during continuous agricultural activities (cropping). The yard around the house has been modified though landscaping.

Conclusions and Recommendations

An archaeologically sensitive landscape feature, within 200m of water, was identified as Cabramatta Creek and smaller tributary flows through the west of the study area. Due to the close proximity to the creek the study area is considered to be on a sensitive landform for Aboriginal cultural heritage. The paddock situated to the west of Cabramatta Creek has been previously disturbed by ploughing only, while on the east bank residential structures have been constructed and agricultural activities have been carried out over a large percentage of the land. The west section of the property is inferred to have been previously disturbed only by ploughing and limited agricultural use. Therefore, the disturbance in this area is considered to have only moderately reduced the archaeological potential of the landform in the west, while in the east the archaeological potential is considered much lower.

Based on the previous investigations in the area, and a site inspection, the study area was located outside of previously documented archaeological sites and/or areas of high archaeological potential. The entirety of the property can also be considered to have been subject to various forms of disturbance, over the past 50 years. These forms of disturbance include building construction, ploughing and gardening, construction of water/drainage installations, and the construction of several subterranean and overhead

services; and possible land-surface modification through filling or cutting. These types of disturbance are considered likely to have impacted upon topsoils (and any associated cultural materials) in the study area, which would have been shallow originally (as is characteristic of Blacktown soils). For this reason, any proposed development in the east area is considered to have low risk of harming Aboriginal objects (see **Table 1**).

However, the western area of the study site is considered to have a low-moderate risk of Aboriginal objects being present within the study area (**Figure 9**). The extent of historic disturbance from agricultural practices cannot be gauged from the site inspection or desktop study. There is no development currently proposed for this area. However it is recommended that any future work in this area, which is not a low impact activity exempt under the NPW Regulation, will require further investigation under a formal process of Aboriginal community consultation and the preparation of an Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment (ACHA) (**Table 2**).

Site specific recommendations are outlined below:

- It is considered that there is a low risk of Aboriginal objects being present within the eastern portion of the study area (shown in **Figure 9**). However, the nature of the disturbance does not preclude the potential for isolated finds, which is a common site type across the region, even in disturbed contexts. In the event that unexpected Aboriginal objects, sites or places (or potential Aboriginal objects, sites or places) are discovered during construction, all works in the vicinity of the find should cease and Joshua Farkash & Associates Pty Ltd should determine the subsequent course of action in consultation with a heritage professional and/or the relevant State government agency as appropriate. A process of consultation with representatives of the Aboriginal community will also be required.
- It is considered that the western portion of the study area (shown in **Figure 9**) has low evidence of previous disturbance, and is comprised of an archaeological landform of interest, namely an alluvial flat of Cabramatta Creek. Any ground disturbance in this area has moderate-high risk of harming Aboriginal objects. Further assessment in the form of an Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment would be required to characterise any cultural deposits and allow for Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permits (AHIP) to be sought (if required) prior to any development in this area.
- This documentation may be summarised within and/or appended to a Development Application, Statement of Environmental Effects (SEE) or Review of Environment Factors (REF). If any Aboriginal objects are later identified within the proposed activity area, this report cannot however be used to support an application for an Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit (AHIP). Such an application would require more detailed investigation involving a formal process of Aboriginal community consultation and the preparation of an Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment (ACHA).
- If human skeletal material less than 100 years old is discovered, the *Coroners Act 2009* requires that all works should cease and the NSW Police and the NSW Coroner's Office should be contacted. Traditional Aboriginal burials (older than 100 years) are protected under the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974* and should not be disturbed. Interpreting the age and nature of skeletal remains is a specialist field and an appropriately skilled archaeologist or physical anthropologist should therefore be contacted to inspect the find and recommend an appropriate course of action. Should the skeletal material prove to be archaeological Aboriginal remains, notification of OEH and the Local Aboriginal Land Council will be required. Notification should also be made to the Commonwealth Minister for the Environment, under the provisions of the *Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Heritage Protection Act 1984*.

Table 1 *Response to the OEH due diligence questions for the eastern portion of the study area.*

1	<i>Will the activity disturb the ground surface or any culturally modified trees?</i> Yes, the proposed activity consists of residential development within the west of the study area, and will result in ground disturbance.	Proceed to question 2.
2a	<i>Are there any relevant confirmed site records or other associated landscape feature information on AHIMS?</i> Yes. The AHIMS database does record one sites within the study area, however this site has been deregistered. The nearest registered AHIMS site is >150m away.	Proceed to question 2b.
2b	<i>Are there any other sources of information of which a person is already aware?</i> No. The research undertaken for the present assessment did not identify any other relevant sources of information indicating the presence of known sites within the study area. This is despite several previous archaeological investigations that investigated or considered this study area.	Proceed to question 2c.
2c	<i>Are there any landscape features that are likely to indicate presence of Aboriginal objects?</i> Yes. The study area is located on a landform of interest. It is within 200m from a permanent water source, Cabramatta Creek.	Proceed to question 3.
3	<i>Can harm to Aboriginal objects listed on AHIMS or identified by other sources of information and/or can the carrying out of the activity at the relevant landscape features be avoided?</i> No. The proposed activity is unlikely to harm any previously listed Aboriginal objects/sites in the study area. The landscape feature of interest, being within 200m of Cabramatta Creek, will be impacted on the east and west banks, however the east area is assessed as highly disturbed and of low risk to contain Aboriginal objects.	Further assessment not required in the eastern area, works may proceed with caution. Further assessment is required in the western area (see Figure 9).
4	<i>Does a desktop assessment and visual inspection confirm that there are Aboriginal objects or that they are likely?</i> Assessment and inspection indicates that the study area has been subject to ground disturbance in the historical period, through vegetation clearance, use of the land for pasture and cultivation, and imported fill. This disturbance from the east bank of the creek to the eastern boundary of the study area is likely to have substantially impacted any archaeological remains of past Aboriginal occupation in this area, and to have reduced the likelihood of the presence of Aboriginal objects. The area from the west bank of the creek to the western boundary has been subject to moderate surface disturbance but may not have reduced the likelihood of the presence of Aboriginal objects and isolated finds may be present. Further, however the soils in this area are generally relatively shallow, Aboriginal objects have only been recovered in the top 30cm of soil at nearby sites, so such disturbance has a high likelihood of removing any Aboriginal objects were they present.	Further assessment not required in the eastern area, works may proceed with caution. Further assessment is required in the western area (see Figure 9).

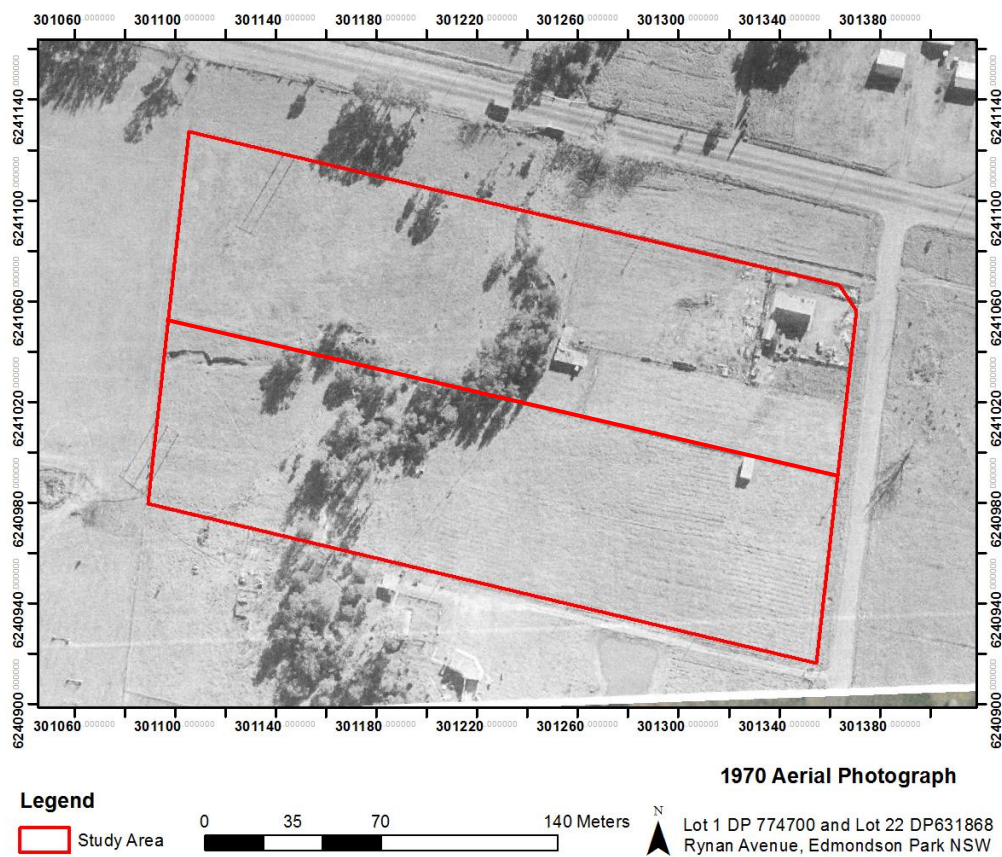


Figure 3: 1970 aerial photograph (NB: Lot 22 DP631868 is the south lot).

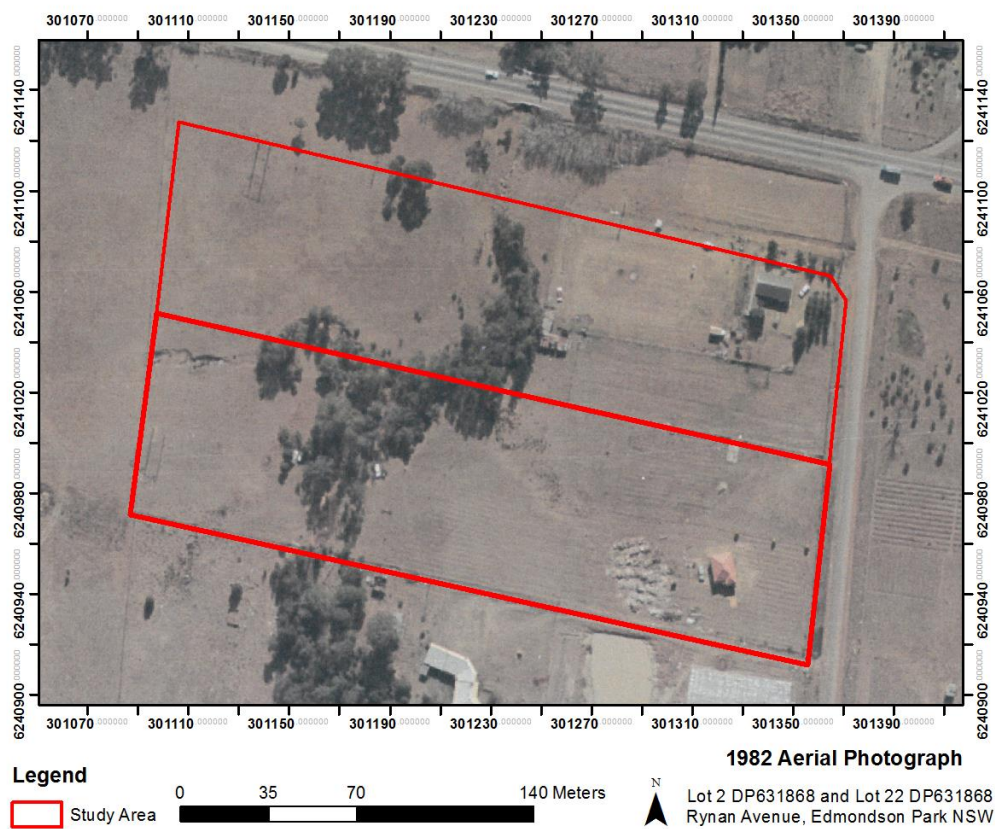


Figure 4: 1982 aerial photograph (NB: Lot 22 Dp631868 is the south lot).

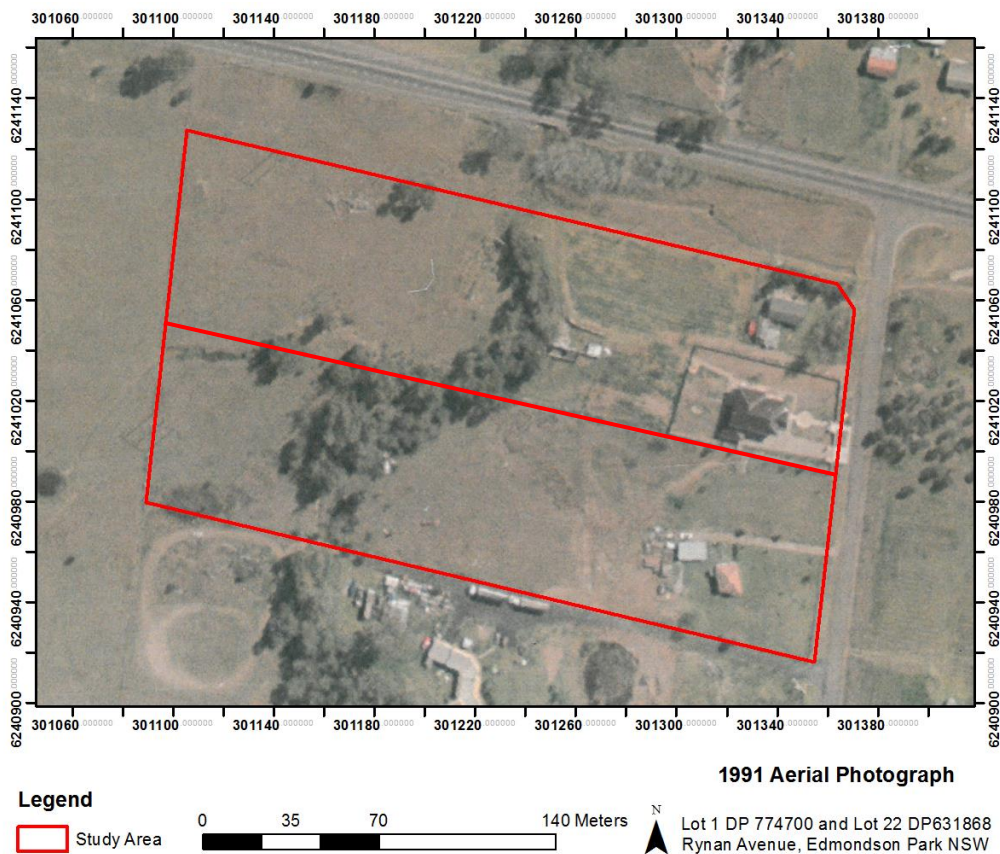


Figure 5: 1991 aerial photograph (NB: Lot 22 Dp631868 is the south lot).

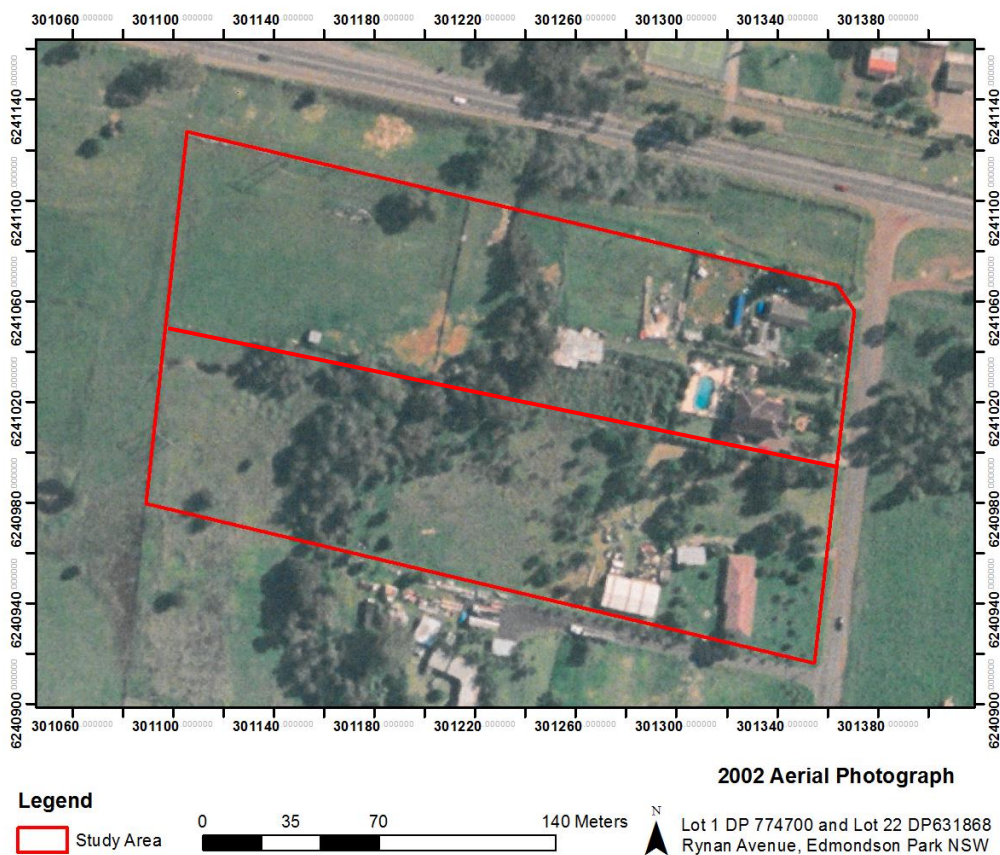


Figure 6: 2002 aerial photograph (NB: Lot 22 DP631868 is the south lot).

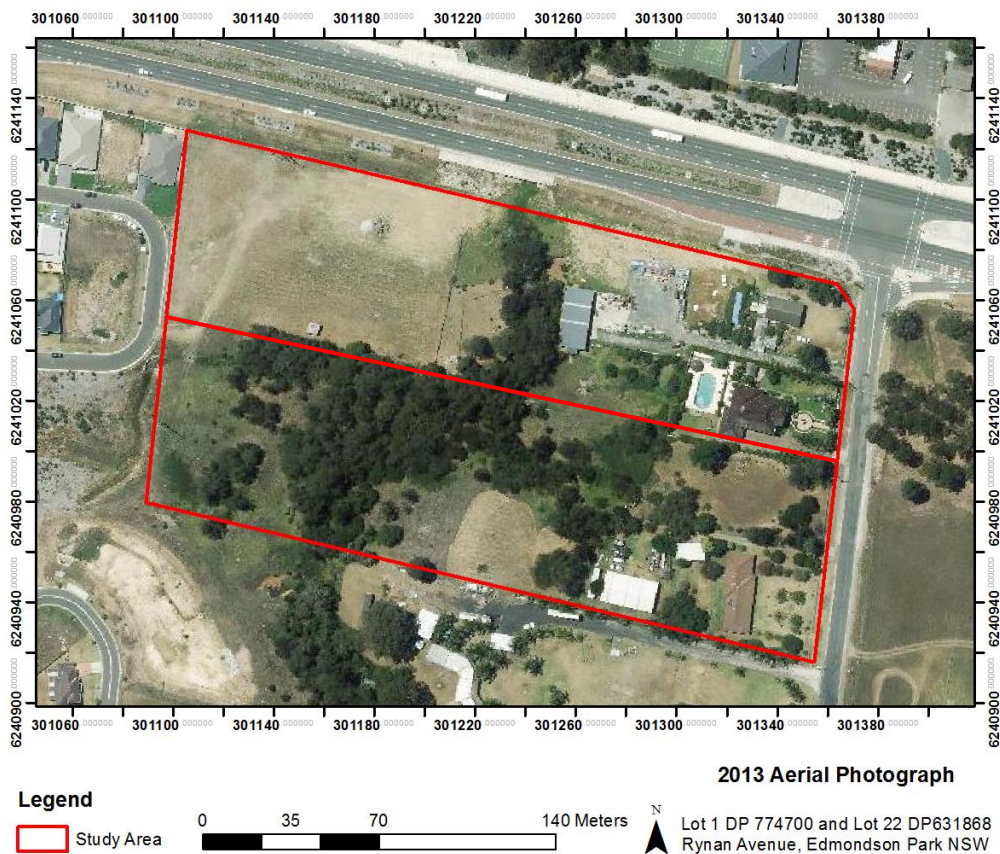


Figure 7: 2013 aerial photograph (NB: Lot 22 DP631868 is the south lot).

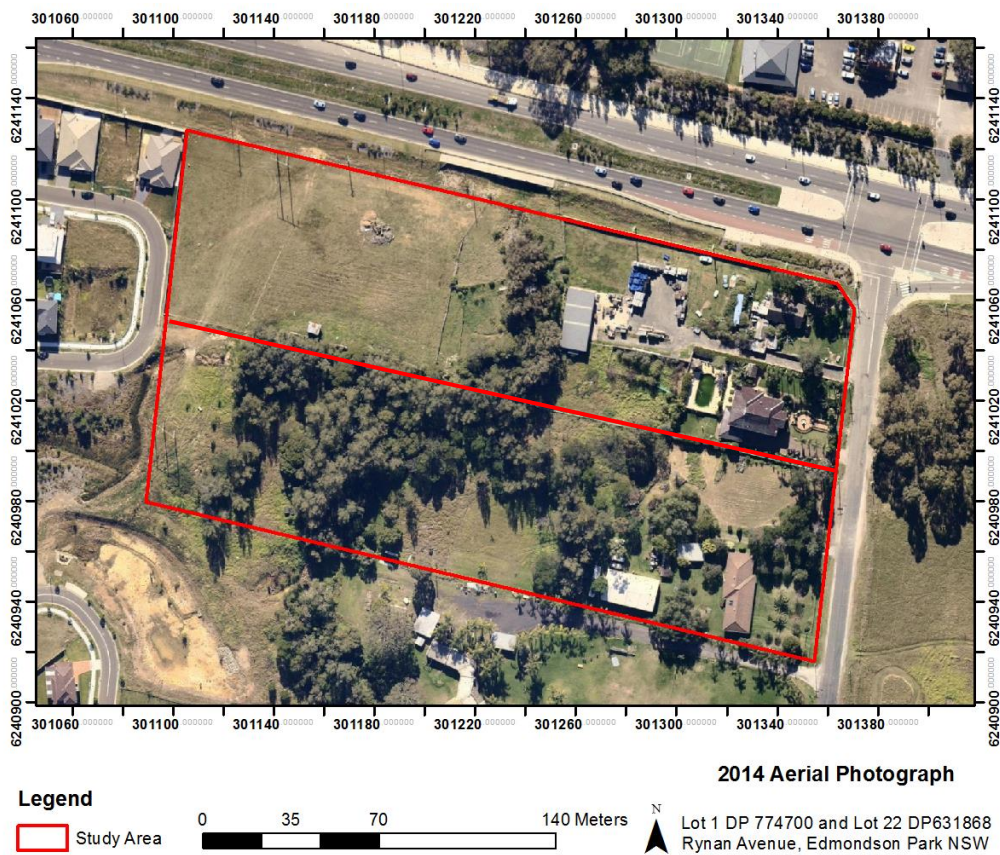


Figure 8: 2014 aerial photograph (Lot 22 DP631868 is the south lot).

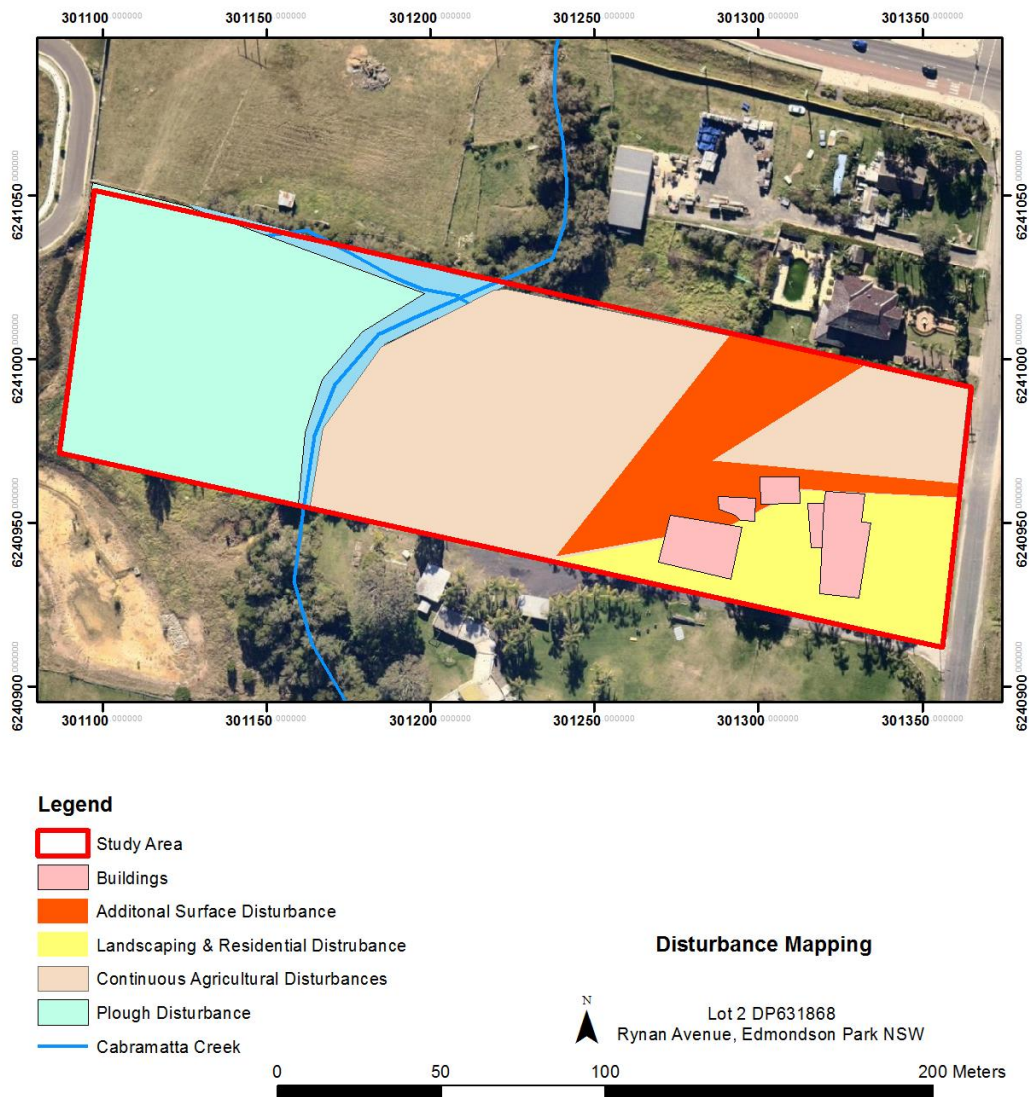


Figure 9: Map showing the built up areas of disturbance evident in aerial photographs from 1970-2014 in the study area Lot 22 DP631868. The areas with plough disturbance and continuous plough disturbance (light blue) are the least disturbed and have a low-moderate potential to contain 'isolated artefacts', which are the most common type of Aboriginal heritage site found in the region. Isolated artefacts are known to occur even in areas where the ground has been disturbed by past activities.

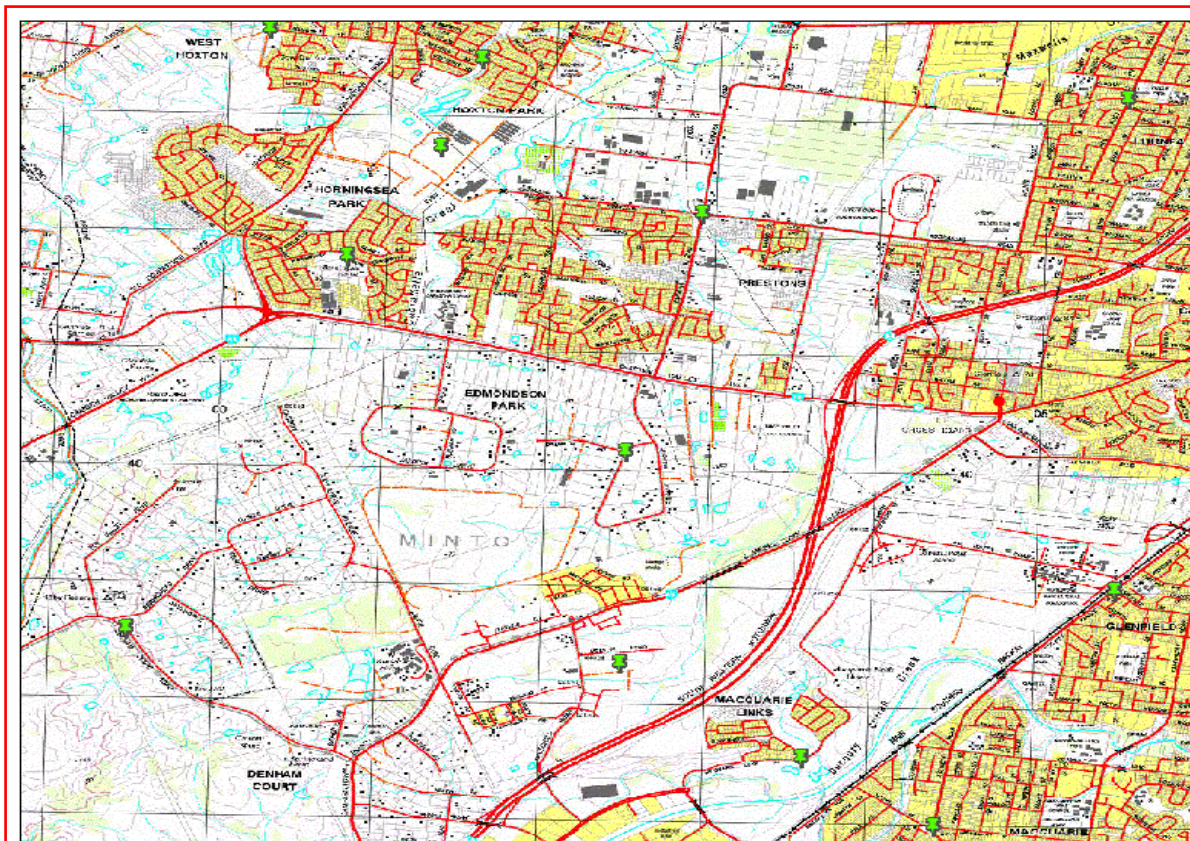
