RE: VPA & Council Briefing

Just following up from our meeting and the responses received so that the VPA and Bio-banking agreement can be finalised.

Item 1 – Bush regeneration costs

Biosis has confirmed that cost associated the years 1 -5 for the project will be sufficient to provide a basis to achieve long term weed management results.

Action: Please confirm that Council is now satisfied with the cost allowance within the schedule.

E2 fencing requirements

Alex's reply - Council is open to a negotiation on fencing style and type as long as it complies with the Biobanking agreement.

Action: Need to select fencing style so that the Bio-banking agreement can be amended to reflect this change.

Fencing Maintenance costs

Alex's Reply - Council is ameliorable to a lesser fencing cost being provided if it reflects the appropriate fencing required for the execution of the Biobanking agreement. The cost is then in proportion of fence cost but we ask that it is an annual maintenance cost, for example \$800 per annum.

Action: To confirm if \$800 per annum is acceptable to council so that this can be applied to cost schedule.
