MATTER DETERMINED

2016SYW154 – Ku-ring-gai – DA0341/16 at 144-146 Killeaton Street St Ives (AS DESCRIBED IN SCHEDULE 1)

PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The Panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and the matters observed at site inspections listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

The Panel determined to approve the development application as described in Schedule 1 pursuant to section 80 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The decision was unanimous.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The reasons for the decision of the Panel were:

The Panel is satisfied that the proposal is a satisfactory development for the site and provides a much needed residential aged care facility.

The Panel was of the opinion that the site has 3 street frontages and that the western boundary is effectively a side boundary condition in relationship to the townhouse development as approved to its west. As such, a Clause 4.6 Variation Request was not required in respect to the rear 25% single storey requirement of the SEPP.

The Panel accepts the Clause 4.6 Variation in respect to height noting that the breach of the height is located centrally and has no detrimental impact on surrounding properties.

CONDITIONS

The development application was approved subject to the conditions in the Council Assessment Report.
