"Wattle Vale" Stage Two Quarry Development

Glen Innes Severn Council has lodged a Development-Application for Stage 2 of the "Wattle Vale" Hard Rock Quarry, located on 1323 Gwydir Highway, Matheson. The development will be considered by the Northern Joint Regional Planning Panel as the consent authority.

The quarry development plans to extract up to 300,000 tonnes per annum and up to 3,000 tonnes per day over 30 years, and will predominantly supply materials for use in public road construction and maintenance.

Council's General Manager, Hein Basson said the project could also fulfil an anticipated short and medium term demand for aggregate products for the construction of major wind farm projects in the region.

"In the longer term the quarry will provide a supply of aggregate products to the district replacing the existing quarry east of Glen Innes, which has less than 10 years' remaining capacity", said Mr Basson. "The quarry will also support the significant wind farm construction industry in the Local Government Area; generating the need for goods and services and thereby creating further opportunities for business development in the Glen Innes Highlands."

The quarry is classified as a regional development which means that the Northern Joint Regional Planning Panel is the consent authority, not Council. "The Panel is an independent body and operates with the aim of strengthening decision making on regionally significant development applications such as this. A date is yet to be determined for the Panel to meet to consider the application," Mr Basson said.

The quarry is subject to a Development Application and as part of that Application, an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) has been prepared. The Development Application and EIS are currently on public exhibition until Monday, 20 February 2017. Both documents can be found on Council's website www.gisc.nsw.gov.au, under the Development Applications Advertised tab, and at the Town Hall and Church Street offices of Council.
