DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST	Michael Megna and Angelo Tsirekas declared a conflict of interest due to the Council connection to the site of the proposed development.

Public meeting held at Christie Conference Centre, 3 Spring Street Sydney, on 18 January 2018, opened at 10.15am and closed at 12.30pm.

MATTER DETERMINED

2017SCL013 - Canada Bay - DA2017.0023 at 8-12 Kings Road Five Dock (AS DESCRIBED IN SCHEDULE 1)

PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The Panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and the matters observed at site inspections listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

The Panel determined to approve the development application as described in Schedule 1 pursuant to section 80 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The Panel adjourned during the meeting to allow time for the applicant to submit a clause 4.6 variation request and for council to assess this document.

The Panel further adjourned during the meeting to deliberate on the matter and formulate a resolution.

The decision was unanimous.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The reasons for the decision of the Panel were:

- The proposal complies with all relevant controls, with the exception of parking. As regards the provision of parking, the Panel was satisfied with the council's assessment of the cl 4.6 justification submitted by the applicant to justify the parking layout.
 - The Panel accepts that the clause 4.6 variation request is well founded and there is sufficient environmental grounds to justify the variation. There is considerable benefit in providing additional onsite car parking in order to minimise current parking congestion in Kings Avenue.
- The proposal provides for an important social need, that of aged accommodation.
- The proposal is in an ideal location for aged housing.

CONDITIONS

The development application was approved subject to the conditions in the Council Assessment Report as amended by the council memo dated 17 January 2018 with the following further amendments.

- Condition 8 is deleted.
- Condition 22 to be amended to include the following:

 The landscape plan to be changed so that two lophosteman confertus on the northwest boundary are to be replaced with two banksia intergrifolia.
- Condition 28 is deleted.
- Amend Condition 31 to include the following sentence within the condition:
 The "stop sign" should not obstruct the driver's view of the footpath via the splayed walls in condition 5 herein.
- Condition 76 is amended to delete all references to demolition.
- An additional condition is imposed requiring that lifts not be used for the management of garbage disposal.
- An additional condition is imposed requiring an 800mm hedging with a mature height of 3m on the western boundary adjacent to the proposed temporary bin storage area.
