PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The Panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and the matters observed at site inspections listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

The Panel determined to approve the development application as described in Schedule 1 pursuant to section 80 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The Panel adjourned during the meeting to deliberate on the matter and formulate a resolution.

The decision was unanimous

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The reasons for the decision of the Panel were:

The proposal strikes an appropriate balance between the needs of the school, the standard of design and the creation of public domain and access through site.

The proposal protects the identified heritage items on the site and is in keeping with the desired future character of the area.

The development of an early intervention centre, new primary school and the expansion of the high school will provide much needed school and community facilities.

CONDITIONS

The development application was approved subject to the conditions in the Council Assessment Report with the following amendments:

Condition 20 a) to be amended to read as following:

The hours of operation of the child care centre being restricted to between the hours of 7.00am and 7.00pm Mondays and Sundays.

Condition 20 b) to be deleted.

Condition 56 to be amended to reflect the figure of \$141,119.66 as the contribution amount.

Condition 86 to be amended to reflect 22 new trees (not 45 as originally stated).

Condition 87 a) to be amended to reflect "(OHD Landscape Architects Issue D 13/11/17)".

Condition 87 b) to be amended to reflect "(OHD Landscape Architects Issue D 13/11/17)".

Condition 87 c) to be amended to reflect "(OHD Landscape Architects Issue D 13/11/17)".
