MATTER DETERMINED

2017SSW039 – Campbelltown – DA 1281/2017/DA-SW AT Lot 113 & 115 DP 1218190, Lot 111 DP 1200781, Macdonald and Campbelltown Road, Bardia (AS DESCRIBED IN SCHEDULE 1)

PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The Panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and the matters observed at site inspections listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

The Panel determined to approve the development application as described in Schedule 1 pursuant to section 80 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The decision was unanimous.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The reasons for the decision of the Panel were:

- The proposal will facilitate further supply and choice of housing within the Sydney Western City District and the Campbelltown LGA in a locality planned for further residential development.
- The proposal satisfies the relevant State legislation and State Environmental Planning Policies including the Rural Fires Act 1997, the Water Management Act 2000, SEPP (State Significant Projects), SEPP (Sydney Region Growth Centres) 2006 and its associated Indicative Layout Plan, SEPP55 -Remediation of Land, SEPP (Infrastructure) 2007.
- The proposal is consistent with the Concept Approval issued by the PAC under Part 3A of the EP&A Act and adequately satisfies the objectives and provisions of the Edmonson Park DCP 2012.
- The proposal subject to the conditions imposed will have no unacceptable impacts on the natural or built environments including the local riparian system, the local ecology, Aboriginal or European heritage and the prosed development integrates with the local road system.
- The Panel considers that the proposal is a suitable use of the land and approval of the application is in the public interest.

CONDITIONS

The development application was approved subject to the conditions in the Council Assessment Report.
