Re: Rockwood Quarry – DA10.2017.35776.1 – Revised EIS exhibition

Thank you for the opportunity to provide advice on the Rockwood Quarry Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). This is a response from NSW Department of Planning & Environment – Division of Resources & Geoscience (the Division).

The building and construction industries in NSW require the ongoing replacement of supplies as current sources are exhausted. The continued sustainable development of existing and new quarries will facilitate the ongoing supply of construction materials to support affordable housing and infrastructure development for the growth of NSW. The resource in the subject area represents an important source of hard rock aggregate and decomposed granite for the local area.

The EIS has adequately described the size and quality of the resource and has demonstrated that both have been adequately assessed; and has documented the methods used to assess the resource and its suitability for the intended applications.

In order to assist in the collection of construction material production data, the proponent should be required to provide annual production data for the subject site to the NSW Division of Resources and Geoscience as a condition of any new or amended development consent.
