#### **PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION**

The Panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

The Panel determined to approve the development application as described in Schedule 1 pursuant to section 80 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The decision was unanimous.

#### **REASONS FOR THE DECISION**

The Panel determines the application by granting approval for the following reasons:

1. The proposal is an extension of well established and centrally located school facilities that are located in an area planned for high quality development. The expanded school facilities will provide valuable additional community facilities to serve the area's growing population.
2. The proposal complies with nearly all development standards and guidelines, with the exception of building height, an application to vary this standard has been received.
3. The Panel is satisfied that the applicant's request to vary the development standard has adequately addressed the matters required to be demonstrated in Clause 4.6 (3) and the proposed development will be in the public interest because it is consistent with the objectives of the standard and the objectives within the zone.
4. The design of the proposal has been carefully reviewed by the Design Excellence Advisory Panel and responds to that Panel's opinions. The final design is considered to be appropriate and compatible with the planned future character of the area.

#### **CONDITIONS**

The development application was approved subject to the conditions in the Council Assessment Report with the following amendments.

1. Exterior lighting: Any exterior lighting to be extinguished between 7:00 AM and 10:00 PM daily except for security lighting. Any security lighting is to be directed away from adjoining properties to

prevent nuisance light spill pursuant to AS 4282-1997 – Control of the obtrusive effects of odour lighting:

Reason: To mitigate lighting impacts to adjoining properties.





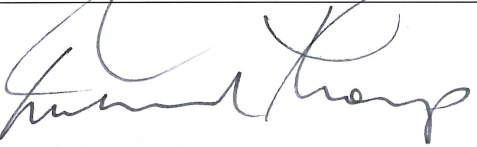
