## DA2018/55: Lot 13 DP 1081768; 103 Gormans Hill Road, Gormans Hill; Extractive Industry

Thank you for your letter dated 28 February 2018 referring DA2018/55 to Roads and Maritime Services for comment.

The documentation submitted in support of the proposed development has been reviewed. Roads and Maritime notes the proposal will, on average, extract 40,000 tonnes per annum of gravel material from the site with peak operations extracting 90,000 tonnes per annum. During peak operations, the quarry will generate a maximum of four heavy vehicle movements per hour. The heavy vehicle haulage includes the intersection of Lloyds and Vale (MR54) Roads. DA2018/55 has been referred to Roads and Maritime in accordance with section 16 of *State Environmental Planning Policy (Mining, Petroleum Production and Extractive Industries)* 2007.

Pursuant to section 16 of *State Environmental Planning Policy (Mining, Petroleum Production and Extractive Industries)* 2007, Roads and Maritime provides the following recommendations for Council's consideration:

- Safe Intersection Sight Distance in accordance with Part 4A of *Austroads Guide to Road Design* is to be provided and maintained at the intersection of the site access and Gormans Hill Road.
- Haulage operations coinciding with local student school bus pick up/drop off times are to be avoided.
- In accordance with clause 16(1) of State Environmental Planning Policy (Mining, Petroleum Production and Extractive Industries) 2007, the applicant is to prepare and implement a driver code of conduct for the task of transporting materials on public roads.
