# PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The Panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and briefings and the matters observed at site inspections listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

The Panel determined to approve the development application pursuant to section 4.16 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The decision was unanimous.

## **REASONS FOR THE DECISION**

- The proposed mental health facility responds to a need in the criminal justice system.
- The proposal has no material adverse environmental impact including no adverse heritage impact.
- The proposal complies with the relevant planning controls.

### CONDITIONS

The development application was approved subject to the conditions in the Council Assessment Report.

#### CONSIDERATION OF COMMUNITY VIEWS

The exhibition of the proposal did not attract any written public submissions. There were no verbal submissions at the public meeting. The Panel received, on the day of the public meeting, a copy of a letter to the editor of the Southern Courier, objecting to the parking overflow caused by the entire facility, rather than by the proposed mental health building. In the Panel's view, this did not justify any changes to the proposal.
