LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE PROGRAM

Maintenance shall mean the care and maintenance of the landscape works by accepted horticultural practice as rectifying any defects that become apparent in the landscape works under normal use. This shall include, but shall not be limited to, watering, mowing, fertilising, reseeding, returfing, weeding, pest and disease control, staking and tying, replanting, cultivation, pruning, aerating, renovating, top dressing, maintaining the site in a neat and tidy condition as follows:-

The landscape contractor shall maintain the landscape works for the term of the maintenance (or Plant establishment) period to the satisfaction of the council. The landscape contractor shall attend to the site on a weekly basis. The maintenance period shall commence at practical completion and continue for a period of three (3) months.

Grass, trees and garden areas shall be watered regularly so as to ensure continuous healthy growth.

During the term of the maintenance period the landscape contractor shall remove rubbish that may occur and reoccur throughout the maintenance period. This work shall be carried out regularly so that at weekly intervals the area may be observed in a completely clean and tidy condition.

The landscape contractor shall replace all plants that are missing, unhealthy or dead at the Landscape Contractor's cost. Replacements shall be of the

continuing basis not exceeding two (2) weeks after the plant has died or is seen to be missing. The landscape contractor shall replace or adjust plant stakes, and tree guards as necessary or as directed by the Landscape Architect. Remove stakes

Trees and shrubs shall be pruned as directed by the Landscape Architect. Pruning will be directed at the maintenance of the dense foliage or miscellaneous pruning and beneficial to the condition of the plants. Any damaged growth shall be pruned. All pruned material shall be removed from the

MULCHED SURFACES

All mulched surfaces shall be maintained in a clean and tidy condition and be reinstated if necessary to ensure that a depth of 75mm is maintained. Ensure mulch is kept clear of plant stems at all times.

PEST AND DISEASE CONTROL

The landscape contractor shall spray against insect and fungus infestation with all spraying to be carried out in accordance with the manufacturer's directions. Report all instances of pests and diseases (immediately that they are detected) to the Landscape Architect.

The landscape contractor shall maintain all grass and turf areas by watering, weeding, reseeding, rolling, mowing, trimming or other operations as necessary. Seed and turf species shall be the same as the original specified mixture. Grass and turf areas shall be sprayed with approved selective herbicide against broad leafed weeds as required by the Landscape Architect and in accordance with the manufacturer's directions. Grass and turf areas shall be fertilised once a year in autumn with "Dynamic Lifter" for lawns at a rate of 20kg per 100m2. Fertiliser shall be watered in immediately after application. Irregularities in the grass and turf shall be watered in immediately after application. Grass and turf areas shall be kept mown to maintain a healthy and vigorous sward. Mowing height: 30-50mm.

WEED ERADICATION

Eradicate weeds by environmentally acceptable methods using a non-residual glyphosate herbicide (eg. 'Roundup') in any of its registered formulae, at the recommended maximum rate. Regularly remove by hand, weed growth that may occur or recur throughout grassed, planted and mulched areas. Remove weed growth from an area 750mm diameter around the base of trees in grassed areas. Continue eradication throughout the course of the works and during the maintenance period.

SOIL SUBSIDENCE

Any soil subsidence or erosion which may occur after the soil filling and preparation operations shall be made good by the landscape contractor at no

Any existing trees and vegetation to be retained shall be preserved and protected from damage of any sort during the execution of landscape work. In particular, root systems of existing plants must not be disturbed. Any nearby site works should be carried out carefully using hand tools. Trees shall not be removed or lopped unless specific written approval to do so is given or is indicated on plan. Storage of materials, mixing of materials, vehicle parking, disposal of liquids, machinery repairs and refuelling, site office and sheds, and the lighting of fires shall not occur within three (3) metres of any existing or new trees. Do not stockpile soil, rubble or other debris cleared from the site, or building materials within the drip line of existing or new trees. All vegetation not shown on plan to be

Services and utilities locations have been derived from the survey provided by The Client. Pits may not have been opened to verify the type of utility. Excavation has not been carried out to confirm underground location. Service details should be confirmed with the relevant service authority during design and prior to commencement of construction.

3. SOIL PREPARATION

All proposed planting areas are to be deep ripped to 300mm and clay soils to be treated with clay breaker. 75mm depth of A.N.L. Organic Garden Mix to be imported and combined with 25mm depth Greenlife compost or approved equivalent. Care to be taken to hand cultivate in any area near existing tree roots to preserve health of trees.

Newly planted super advanced trees are to be secured with 3 @ 1.8m x 22mm x 22mm hardwood stakes with hessian ties to prevent excessive movement. Planting holes for plants are to be large enough to take the root ball with additional space for back fill with with soil prepared as in 3.

5. PLANT SPECIFIC INFORMATION

To minimise infection plants are to be planted 50mm higher than finished soil level & mulched with course Grade Hardwood chip mulch. At first signs of fungus, spray with Phosphatic acid & follow up 2 weeks later. This is to take precedent over all other notes on plan. Where possible plant in native mix or crushed sandstone.

Gardens, unless otherwise specified, to be mulched with ACE Landscapes (or equivalent) 'Eucy' mulch to 75mm deep with catchment dish to be left around base of plants. Not to be used next to gravel areas. Cow and compost not to be used around native plants. Where specified, supply and place 20mm Marulean Gravel to a depth of 50mm on a 75mm deep

layer of compacted road base.

7. FERTILISER

On completion of work all planting areas are to be fertilised with 'Organic Life fertiliser' and 'Blood and Bone' to manufacturers specifications, which is to be sufficiently watered in.

All planter beds adjacent to lawn areas to have flush steel edges of 100x4mm untreated mild steel flat bar. Bar to be set in concrete haunch. Concrete to finish no higher than 40mm from top

Automatic watering system to be selected and installed to extend to all landscaped areas included in works including lawn areas. The Landscape Contractor is to liaise with Council as necessary, to ensure that the irrigation system conforms with all Water Board, Council & Australian standards and regulations. All plants to be hand watered as necessary throughout establishment period

11. DRAINAGE

Unless otherwise noted on plan, contractor is to make provisions for sufficient drainage to garden beds, raised planters and lawn areas to ensure optimum conditions for plant growth All plans assume that stormwater and sewer connections are working efficiently. SRL recommends a hydraulic engineer reviews the current stormwater situation prior to installation to ensure they are capable of supporting increased use.

12.POOL ENCLOSURE

Turf to be 'Sapphire Buffalo'. Turf to be laid on 50mm topsoil over 200mm deep rotary hoed prepared area. Turf areas to be evenly graded. Adequate drainage to be provided under lawn area.

15. SET OUT AND HARD CONSTRUCTION

All reduced levels, boundaries and tree locations are derived from the survey provided by The Client. All civil, structural and hydraulic work associated with this project shall be to consulting Engineer's details. All external stairs to be constructed in accordance with Clause D2.13 of the Building Code of Australia.
