### **MATTER DETERMINED**

2019SNH008 – Ku-ring-gia – MOD0006/19 at 870-8989 Pacific Highway for modifications to an approved development (as described in Schedule 1)

### PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and briefings and the matters observed at site inspections listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

## **Development application**

The panel determined to approve the development application pursuant to section 4.55 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The decision was unanimous.

### **REASONS FOR THE DECISION**

- The modified proposal is substantially the same as the original proposal.
- The proposed modifications will not have any material adverse impact on the surroundings.
- The Panel notes that the lift tower is taller by 1.5m than in the original application and that some of air conditioning plant has been re-located to the roof. While a written submission under cl 4.6 of the LEP is not required for a modification application, the Panel accepts that the minor changes to the height are consistent with the objectives of the zone and of the development standard.

### **CONDITIONS**

The development application was approved subject to the conditions in the council assessment report.

# **CONSIDERATION OF COMMUNITY VIEWS**

In coming to its decision, the Panel considered one written submission made during the public exhibition. There was no objector at the meeting. The Panel is satisfied that the written objection related to matters arising out of the original application and does not warrant changes to the modification application.
