KEY ISSUES DISCUSSED AND MATTERS TO BE ADDRESSED IN THE COUNCIL ASSESSMENT REPORT:

- The key issue for the assessment of this site at this stage is the compatibility between the proposed works and the proposed use with the planning for the Aerotropolis Initial Precincts which the Panel understands to be ongoing, due completion sometime in 2020.
- The purpose of the bulk earthworks nominated in the application is waste resource recovery facility, where continuation of that use in the long term would be likely to conflict with the public interest given the low chance of such a use being compatible with the land use planning expected 800 metres from the new airport. The site's location is important to the future planning for the new Aerotropolis.
- The Panel understands the reported eagerness of the land owner to progress its own planning for the site, and not to be delayed with its proposed bulk earthworks which will no doubt take some time to complete.
- The Council has noted that while the bulk earthworks might be permissible for the nominated use of waste disposal facility, that use may well be prohibited or discouraged on

- the site by the adopted planning controls and policies when they ultimately emerges from the precinct planning process.
- These are important issues, and the Panel is pleased to note that a meeting to be attended
 by representatives of the Council, the Department and the Applicant is scheduled over the
 next weeks to investigate the consistency of the applicant's proposals with the Precinct
 planning.
