#### KEY ISSUES DISCUSSED

##### Council Briefing

- Clarification of EPA issues with current operations of the site requested (noting EPA declined invitation to Panel meeting) and whether proposal will result in operational improvements
- Request for Information issued in May regarding:
  - Additional measures to address odour
  - Detailed background of the site regarding odour
  - Dust suppression measures
- Applicant response to RFI was limited to water sprayers for dust suppression measures, written response to odour management impacts and limited details of previous site approvals. No engineering or physical changes proposed (ie. amendment to windrow technology or inclusion to cover the facility)
- Additional information has been referred internally, with Council to re-refer additional information to the EPA to consider odour impacts
- Council reliant on the EPA for technical odour expertise
- Independent odour expertise may be required to peer review and provide specific advice

#### Applicant Briefing

- Interpretation of EPA request for information is resulting for change in EPA staffing.
- Site audit undertaken of existing facility, with additional information being provided as per approval requirements (ie. management plans)
- Current operations are complying with odour requirements in the POEO Act, with compliance confirmed utilizing the 2016 modelling
- Draft Odour Management Strategy waiting Council approval.
- Windrow turners will provide additional oxygen to the rows, with odour unit indicating a 40% improvement resulting from the proposal
- Windrow turner and maturing of compost material will result in time efficiencies and significant odour benefits

#### Next Steps

- Council to provide submitted additional information to the EPA and confirm the commentary in previous correspondence in regard to non-compliance has been met.
- Council to request details of EPA site audit on 08/04/22
- Independent peer review of odour is recommended
