MATTER DETERMINED

PPSHCC-133 – Newcastle – DA2022/00588 at 60 Riverside Drive, Mayfield West– battery storage facility (as described in Schedule 1).

PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The Panel considered the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and briefings listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

The Panel has had the benefit of an initial briefing from Council and the applicant, and a final briefing from Council.

This application is similar to PPSHCC-69 on the adjoining lot and which the Panel considered and determined in October 2021. The site is part of a broader industrial subdivision that is under construction and is a suitable location for the use.

The key issues associated with this application are:

- Hazard and risk.
- Visual impact.
- Relationship of the development to adjoining properties.
- Relationship to existing approved subdivision.

The above matters have been adequately addressed in the Council report. The Panel notes that there has been no hazard and risk analysis of the generic general battery storage proposal. For this reason, the Panel has not approved the potential for a generic battery storage option as part of this application.

The Panel is satisfied that the finished levels are consistent with the approved subdivision. The visual impacts and landscape treatment is acceptable given surrounding development and distance from the highway. External materials have been conditioned to be a more recessive light colour – essentially not white.

The Panel notes that the approval for PPSHCC-69 is required to be surrendered and a condition has been included to require this.

The Panel considers that the site is suitable for the facility and is satisfied of the merits of the proposal and considers that potential impacts and hazards can be mitigated and managed.

Development application

The Panel determined to approve the development application pursuant to section 4.16 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* subject to the conditions in the Council Assessment Report.

The decision was unanimous.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The Panel determined to approve the application for the following reasons:

- The site is suitable for the development.
- The proposed battery storage facility will provide an environmentally sustainable source of energy.
- The potential impacts of the development can be mitigated.

CONDITIONS

The Development Application was approved subject to the conditions in the Council Assessment Report.

CONSIDERATION OF COMMUNITY VIEWS

In coming to its decision, the Panel notes that no written submissions were made and therefore no issues of concern were raised.
