







SITE ANALYSIS PLAN



EXISTING SITE PLAN




DEMOLITION PLAN







PROPOSED SITE PLAN



PROPOSED OVERALL UPPER & LOWER GROUND FLOOR PLANS







5 S6A - PROPOSED SECTION (BLOCK F GLA6)






Bush Fire

- Site contains bushfire prone lands affected from the north
- Entire site to be maintained as an APZ
- Subject to compliance with the Bushfire Protection Measures within the Bush Fire Assessment Report, the proposal has been determined to meet the key objectives listed under Section 6.4 – Development of existing SFPP facilities in PBP.
- The proposed works will not occur closer to the bushfire hazard then than the existing buildings.
- BAL rating required 12.5 with a recommended APZ
- A Bushfire Evacuation Plan is to be prepared for the site

Traffic

- Large site with adequate capacity to contain all construction traffic requirements
- Proposal to allow to grow the school to capacity of 3 stream
- Additional 3 car parking spaces can be met within the existing 132 spaces on site.
- Existing carpark capacity exceeds the DCP requirements
- Existing school drop off and pickup arrangements has adequate capacity to accommodate 11 additional vehicles in accordance with the DCP.





Ecological Assessment Report

Proposed Development Lot 11 DP 1045814, 165 Serpentine Road, Terrigal, NSW

Ecology

- Blackbutt-Turpentine-Sydney Blue Gum mesic tall open forest on ranges of the Central Coast exists within the site
- Three threatened flora species were recorded on Songmeter within the site or nearby surrounds. No suitable roosting or breeding habitat noticed on site.
- 5 Part Test determined no significant impacts
- Chapter 4 Koala Habitat Protection does not apply to the site
- Arborist has recommended removal of trees within the building footprint
