### **KEY ISSUES DISCUSSED**

- Council are considering a few related DAs that are not regionally significant access to King St from carpark change to access from Bull St reconfiguration to allow for subdivision
- Proposed built form is a podium top with two towers one for seniors living and one RFB, over basement car parking accessed from Bull St which will service both towers with parking requirements.
   The bottom floor will have a commercial arrangement with public access including an activated space with public art
- Had a meeting with Public art reference group and decision made to incorporate a memorial to victims of earthquake at old workers club site
- On a key site, so required to satisfy design excellence. The application has a waiver no concerns raised from urban design panel
- Referred to Council heritage staff
- Minor lift overrun, FSR and set-back issues
- The application does not rely on the seniors housing SEPP. Applicant is using definition as per LEP.
  Council is still considering the principals and guidelines etc eg, ambulance bays
- No major issues identified at this point.
- Council is waiting on additional info from applicant Ausgrid and street trees

- City greening aren't supportive of the proposed number of tree removals. Trees wouldn't be able to survive the structural development changes, so applicant will have to consider replacement. Paper bark trees in the centre have some important elements to do with earthquake and when they were planted.
- Stormwater and access arrangements
- No submissions unusual for a DA for this size
