MATTER DEFERRED

PPSHCC-242 – Port Stephens – DA 16 -2023 – 385 - 1 at 1154 Clarence Town Road, Seaham 2324 – Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) (as described in Schedule 1).

REASONS FOR DEFERRAL

The Panel considered the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at the meetings observed at the site inspection listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

This application is one (1) of five (5) applications for a Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) lodged on the same site in the south western corner of the site. Each application abuts the other so as to form a compound. Each BESS has a 5MW capacity, can operate independently and has separate connections to the grid. They have all been lodged at a similar time.

The Panel has considered these applications both individually and cumulatively. The Panel has had a number of briefings from both Council and the applicant and heard from a number of submitters. The Panel had raised a number of issues that needed to be addressed in the initial briefing.

The report before the Panel recommends approval of the application and has considered the cumulative effect of the proposal in the context of the other four (4) applications. The Panel acknowledges the need and benefit of these facilities. However, they need to be designed and respond to the characteristics and constraints of the site. In this instance the Panel requires further information to properly consider the merits of the proposal and to ensure consistency and accuracy in the documents the Panel is relying on.

Arising from the Panels deliberation it was clear that there are inconsistencies in the operation of the proposal and the Fire Incident Management Plan. The Panel is also not clear on the extent of disturbed land and actual loss of trees. The Panel considers that the site may be suitable for this facility but requires further information.

The Panel agrees to defer the determination of the matter for the applicant to provide additional information and amended documents that:

- Clarify the extent of disturbed and undisturbed area on a plan that reconciles and explains the numbers in the Ecological Assessment Report. A plan showing the actual trees to be removed is also required.
- 2. Clarification that all engineering works are captured in the ecology report for the access road.
- 3. Clarification of the standard of road construction and detailed in plan.
- 4. An updated Fire Incident Management Plan that reflects the application lodged and is consistent with how the site is to be operated.

- 5. Clarification whether the 11KW under boring works on the site are part of the Part 5 Authorisation by Ausgrid or are part of this application.
- 6. Clarification of night time lighting (i.e. is it controlled by sensor)
- 7. Extent of access to the site during a flood and the height of the road required to access site in the event of flood.
- 8. Details of materials proposed for the acoustic fence.
- 9. Clarification of the status of other applications for BESS in the vicinity of the site.
- 10. Finished RL's of the individual BESS compound.
- 11. Potential measures that could be implemented to ensure appropriate rehabilitation and recycling at the end of the facilities operational life.

The decision to defer is unanimous.

ACTIONS

The Panel agreed to defer the application for:

- 1. The Applicant to provide the information and amendments at point 1-11.
- 2. A formal written request to amend the application is required to be uploaded to Planning Portal by the Applicant within two (2) weeks of this deferral outlining:
 - a. Particulars sufficient to indicate the nature of the change of the development, as required under section 37 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2021
 - b. Updated technical reports relied on in the amended application.
- 3. Council is requested to provide an addendum assessment report responding to the matters above, which is to be uploaded to the Planning Portal within two (2) weeks of the upload of the Applicants required information to the Planning Portal.
- 4. When the updated assessment report is received the Panel will determine the application by way of electronic determination.
