	(Housing for Seniors or People with a Disability) 2004.

The Panel had the benefit of inspecting the site and reviewed the documentation accompanying the application.

The Panel authorises the Chair to notify the applicant, Council and the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment of the Panel's decision to refuse the application.

The decision was unanimous.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

- 1. The density, scale, built form and footprint of the proposal is not consistent with the local character of the area and the likely future rural uses of the surrounding land.
- The proposal is not consistent with Local and State strategies to direct future urban growth towards a
 more compact and sustainable development outcome. The site is not included in the Maitland Urban
 Settlement Strategy/Maitland Strategic Blueprint 2036.

3. The site does not have access to an appropriate level of services and public transport commensurate with the scale and form of the proposed seniors living development and fails to satisfy State Environmental Planning Policy (Housing for Seniors or People with a Disability) 2004.

2	SITE DESCRIPTION	474 Phoenix Park Road Largs (Lot 3 DP 807949)	
3	DEVELOPMENT DESCRIPTION	46 single-storey serviced self-care housing, comprising a mix of two and three bedrooms, a community hall, BBQ, communal area and visitor parking. The development will include internal roads with a primary access from Phoenix Park Road. A separate access from Phoenix Park Road will be retained for the existing dwelling, which will continue to be associated with the existing farm buildings and low-lying agricultural land on the eastern part of the site. The application states it will include options for the provision of meals, cleaning, personal care and nursing services on site. The application is proposed to be serviced self-care housing on land that adjoins land zoned primarily for residential purposes and is sought to be provided under the Retirement Villages Act 1999.
