## SITE COMPATIBILITY CERTIFICATE APPLICATION

PPSNTH-153 - SCC2021PORTM-2 at Bonny View Drive, Bonny Hills (AS DESCRIBED IN SCHEDULE 1)

### PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

By circulation of papers the Panel considered: the material listed at item 5 of Schedule 1 and the matters raised and/or observed at briefings and site inspections listed at item 6 in Schedule 1.

Based on this information, the Panel determined:

	to issue a site compatibility certificate subject to satisfaction of certain requirements (as listed in the
	certificate), because the application has demonstrated that the site is suitable for more intensive
	development and it is compatible with the surrounding environment.
$\boxtimes$	to refuse to issue a site compatibility certificate, because the application:
	As not demonstrated that the site is suitable for more intensive development
	has not demonstrated the proposed development is compatible with the surrounding
	environment and land uses having regard to (at least) the criteria specified in clause 25(5)(b) of
	State Environmental Planning Policy (Housing for Seniors or People with a Disability) 2004.

The Panel authorises the Chair to notify the applicant, council and the Department of Planning and Environment of the panel's decision to refuse the application.

The decision was unanimous.

### **REASONS FOR THE DECISION**

- 1. The panel believes that site of the proposal is not suited to more intensive development because:
  - It is potential High Value Environmental Land under the North Coast Regional Plan 2036 and contains PCT 1230 which is a Threatened Ecological Community under the EPBC Act 1999, potential Koala habitat and may contain other protected flora and fauna;
  - Suitable water and sewerage infrastructure may not be available and arrangements for the provision of this infrastructure have not been settled with the Council.

- 2. The Panel also notes the very high demand for seniors housing in the locality and that the application could help to satisfy some of this demand. Notwithstanding such, this application failed to provide sufficient information to demonstrate that likely potential adverse environmental and physical impacts could be avoided or mitigated.
- 3. The Panel believes there may be merit in the applicant submitting a Planning Proposal that addresses all unresolved ecological and servicing factors.
